

PROSPECTS FAIR FOR LIBERAL EXCISE LAW

BISHOP LAW AMENDMENT HAS BEEN DRAFTED.

Senate and House Each Pass Several Bills and Others Are Introduced—Looks Like a Short Session For State Solons.

An amendment to the Bishop's Law, one of the Statutes regulating the sale of intoxicating liquors in New Jersey, has been drafted and is in the hands of Assistant Attorney General Nelson B. Taskill.

Both Senate and House convened Tuesday, the former holding one session and the latter two, and several bills were passed in either branch.

Following are several bills of general interest introduced in the Senate during the week:

No. 13. Amends the health board act by including in its powers the right to examine cream, skimmed milk, or other daily products.

No. 17. Amends the general insurance act of April, 1902, by permitting companies to be formed either upon the stock or mutual plan for the following kinds of insurance.

No. 19. Supplements general railroad act of 1908, providing for the removal in any accident or death of an injury to an employee that the injured person is a member of an association maintained in whole or in part by the railroad company.

No. 14. Requires defendant in district court cases to plead or verify within five days after service of notice of service has been attached at least ten days before return day.

No. 12. Supplements general insurance act of 1904 by providing that the failure of a person insured against loss by fire to furnish proofs of loss shall not be considered a waiver of rights.

No. 13. Provides that a jury shall determine all questions of negligence or contributory negligence in case of injury or death of an employee of any common carrier.

No. 14. Supplement of the general railroad act of 1908, providing that any unlawful or negligent act of any employee in whole or in part in this State to require as the condition of employment membership in a benefit society in which the railroad contributes in whole or in part.

No. 15. Requires railroads to use every possible method, by screen and otherwise, to prevent fire from their engines along any railroad in the State.

No. 16. An act to link the proceedings of the department of the grand Army of the Republic a part of the military archives of the State, and appropriate the sum of \$500, or so much thereof as may be necessary for that purpose.

No. 18. Amends the act relating to the court of common pleas, revision of 1900, by permitting county judges in counties of the second class, as well as in counties of the first class, to appoint sergeant-at-law; salary in second class counties not to exceed \$500.

No. 17. Mr. Wilson. Supplement to the motor vehicle act, authorizing the commissioner of motor vehicles to appoint any number of citizens, not exceeding forty, to be special inspectors, with all the powers and duties of inspectors provided for in the act to which this is a supplement, but who serve without compensation.

No. 18. Mr. Wilson. An act to regulate the pay of officers and employees of paid fire departments in cities other than cities of the first class. Provides the following salaries: Chief engineer, not more than \$2,500; assistant chief engineer, not more than \$2,000; captain or foreman of engine, not more than \$1,500; to all other employees, not more than \$500 for the first year of service, \$1,000 for the second year, \$1,100 for the third year and not more than \$1,200 for every year thereafter.

No. 19. Mr. Wilson. Appropriates an annual sum not exceeding \$95, to be expended under the direction of the governor, for each person known to be an individual patient in any institution of such county, State board or by the decision of any court.

No. 20. Provides that in second class counties the probation officer shall receive \$1,500 per year salary; provided that the board of fire-wardens shall fix the compensation of additional probation officers when they are needed.

No. 21. Gives county boards of taxation power to adjust reductions of any reductions in valuations made in any taxing district during the preceding five years caused by appraisal of such county board, State board or by the decision of any court.

No. 22. Makes all questions of negligence, contributory negligence and assumption of this a jury question. A short employer's liability act.

No. 23. Provides that the docket of any Justice of the peace must be deposited with the county clerk within thirty days after his death, resignation or other termination of office.

No. 24. By Mr. Edige. Extends the oyster commission act to Burlington County.

No. 25. By Mr. Edige. Amends section 21 of the oyster commission act of 1905 by providing that no persons other than lessee or lessees of oyster lands shall either, go upon, trap, dredge, take or remove any shell fish whatsoever, or any other material from the oyster beds.

No. 26. By Mr. Edige. Prohibits fishing except with hook and line in Mullica river from March 1 to July 1 of each year.

Following the sessions Tuesday both Houses adjourned until Monday morning next, when a number of new bills will be introduced and others taken up for final consideration.

At the present time there is a need of suitable families, children from infants to fifteen years, including colored children, are under the care of this society.

CAPTURE MURDER SUSPECT

Circumstantial Evidence Seriously Implicates William Seyler in the Death of Jane Adams—Nabbed in Virginia by Shore Sleuths.
