MOTOR CHEMICAL ENGINE WILL BE PURCHASED

Better Fire Protection Assured In Near Future.

At a meeting held Thursday evening last in the Fire House, Reliance Hose Company voted to purchase a motor-driven combination chemical hose wagon for the better protection of the municipality against fire. The new apparatus, which will be thoroughly equipped, will be placed in service as soon as it can be built and the company will then be one of the best equipped of its size in this part of the state.

Sentiment in favor of this equipment was overwhelming and the committee, E. C. Shauer, John Schuster and Walter Matthe, were instructed to have it in service of the earliest possible moment.

The machine will be driven by a forty horse-power motor and in addition to carrying fifty-four gallons of chemical fire extinguishers will have a large hose reel, search light, extension ladder, ladders, bell, axes and all other equipment besides room for carrying twelve firemen. A representative of the constructing firm will be here as long as necessary to instruct the members of the company in its operation.

One of the greatest features of this equipment will be its ability to respond to alarms in the outlying districts. The Fire, John W.
