

Mr. A. L. Clark, of the New Jersey State Agricultural College, Assistant State Leader in Farm Demonstration, reports the activities of the county agents of the nine organise counties in the State for the four weeks ending March 4th. These statistics are indicative of the rapid growth of farm demonstration work in New Jersey. During this period, the nine county agents visited a total of 366 farms and 96 demonstrations, received 348 office calls, held 99 meetings, at which there was in attendance of 4,666, wrote 1,182 letters, sent out 1,086 circular letters, and had 61 articles published in the public press. Such activity cannot fall to mise the argicultural industry in the State to a higher plane of efficiency.
