

GERAN ELECTION BILL
SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

MANY CHANGES PROVIDED
IN NEW STATUTE.

Civil Service for Officers—"Sample
Ballots"—an Innovation -- Strict
Methods of Voting Prescribed—
Size of Districts Limited.

Many changes in the election laws are made in the measure known as the German bill, which received the Governor's signature and is now on the statute-books of New Jersey. Some of the changes are so radical that wide publicity is being given to the measure in order to acquaint voters with its provisions. Thousands of copies are being printed and distributed at public expense.

Under the provisions of the new law no election district shall contain more than four hundred voters. The county chairman of each political party which at the last election held a seat in the Assembly must cast the largest and the next largest number of votes shall transmitt to the Civil Service Commission a list of names of persons for election to the office of

county. Five legal voters may also nominate
one election officer by petition. The county
committee shall elect the county chairman at
the first Tuesday after the primaries for a term
of one year. The term of office of the members
of the county committee heretofore elected
shall expire on the first Tuesday after the
primaries.

It is provided that all delegates and alternates to national conventions shall be chosen at the primaries. Primaries for national delegates shall be held on the fourth Tuesday May and shall be conducted under the present primary law as near as may be.

PROVISION FOR SAMPLE BALLOTS.
The Election Board by the Tuesday preceding the primary election must mail a copy of the official sample primary ballot of each party to each registered voter and must in the same by noon of the Wednesday preceding the primary. Each envelope shall have

printed on its face "Sample Primary Ballot."
These sample ballots are to be printed on paper
different in color from the official ballot, and

the clerk of the election board must post the same in the polling place and five other public places.

for the printing of the official sample ballot and mailing one to each registered voter a "prior afternoon" provides the method of voting. Each voter shall first give his

name and address and shall sign the poll book. If found to be registered he shall be given a ballot numbered to correspond to the voter number on the poll book. The ballot shall be so marked that no part of its face is observable.

The voter shall then retire to the booth, prepare his ballot by placing an X opposite the name of the candidate for whom he wishes to vote. Before leaving the booth the
