Fish and Game Seasons. Quail, rabbit, squirrel, male English ring-necked pheasant, ruffed grouse, partridge, Hungarian partridge—November 10 to December 15. Wild turkey—closed season until March 15, 1916. Female English ring-necked pheasant—closed season until April 15, 1916. Red bird—September and October. All small shore birds not designated by name during the open season, little brown, sandpip, and winged grebe, wrens, curlews, upland plover and wood ducks—closed season until September 1, 1916. Shore birds—only black breasted plover, Jack or Wilson snipe and greater and lesser yellow legs—September 1 to December 15. 
