RECKLESS DRIVING HIT BY JUSTICE BLACK

In Charge To Grand Jury He Calls Attention To Violation of Speed Laws—W. W. Clark Named Foreman—Medical Probe Asked.

Alleged violations of the laws governing the practice of medicine by a resort physician and speeding by motorists on County and State roads were the two subjects brought before Court Justice Charles C. Black called to the attention of the new Grand Jurors Tuesday morning, when he formally opened the May term of the Atlantic County Courts. Walter W. Clark, a real estate dealer of Atlantic City, was named as foreman by the Court.

The Court is pleased to say to you that the crime act against conspiracy.
