FORGIVING ALL, WIFE SAVES BRUTAL SPOUSE FROM STATE PRISON

BERTOLINI RELEASED AND PLACED ON PROBATION FOR TWO YEARS

TWO SENT TO TRENTON FOR THEFT

Young Auto Thief Escapes Jail But
Must Pay Fine For Three Years
—Wrecked Stolen Car Near Absecon — Nine Charged of Larceny
Against Light-Fingered Woman.

Postscript efforts of his wife, whom he beat unmercifully several weeks ago at their home on Atlantic Avenue, resulted in the State's decision yesterday, October 5, to take no action against him. He has been held in custody since his arrest on September 21st, and he was released on probation for two years, during which time he must pay a fine of \$200 weekly made by his own work.

Bertolini was sentenced to a term of eighteen months in State Prison when arraigned for trial after a period of eight years ending on the day of his arrest in using a hammer on his head. His wife, Mrs. Bertolini, who had been beaten to a pulp by her husband, was given a maximum sentence. She begged Judge Cole again to let him off; she excused a petition in his behalf every day there has been sent to her, but has been seen a patient little figure in court, waiting her opportunity to speak to the judge.

When Bertolini was arraigned in Court he felt a bit and was taken with another when the Sheriff started to take him to Trenton. Since then he has been too ill to beabout in the County Jail and has received almost daily medical attention. He was released on probation, but was again taken into custody.

Impressed upon Mrs. Bertolini that if he ever tried to beat her again he would be sent to jail and placed in prison.

That Bertolini, a young chauffeur, was arraigned before Judge Cole yesterday on the charge of stealing and wrecking an auto. With three companions he took the machine out without permission, evidently with criminal intent, and wrecked it near Absecon. One of the other boys has been caught but the others are still at large. Bertolini was placed in probation for three years and a fine of \$300 weekly for the same period.

Ralph Peterson and Philip Lunnin, pleading guilty to larceny, were released under suspended sentence.

David Williams was sentenced to a term of six months in the County Jail for assault and battery.

Martin Scott, alias Mary Williams, held on one charge of theft, pleaded guilty to two and was sentenced to terms in State Prison for one to seven years on each charge, terms to run consecutively.

Earl White, adjudged guilty of robbing stores, gained a sentence of from one and one-half to seven years in State Prison.


Frank Norman, adjudged guilty of grand larceny, was sent to the County Jail for a term of three months.
