WITH ALL NOMINATIONS

**Election Most Orderly and Voting  
Was Heavy In City and County  
--Confidence In Organization**

At the first primary election held under the new election laws Tuesday last, the regular Republican candidates carried the day by a routing majority, reaffirming the confidence of the people in the County Organization and the "fusion" and "independent" element rode to a fall. Robert H. Ingalls won the nomination over Edwin A. Parker by a big margin and all the other regular candidates were elected by a heavy vote on the several districts.

Postmaster Harry Bachman, regular candidate for Mayor of Atlantic City won over Daniel B. White, the choice of the Independent-Republican-Democratic fusionists. White made a strong fight in the Third Ward, his home division, and in the First Ward, where the fusion forces of Edwin A. Parker, Independent, ran.

While and Dr. J. B. Thompson, who was defeated for Alderman by Acting Mayor George W. Carmany. Both are made regular Democratic nominees for the November election.

In Hamilton Township a substantial majority was recorded for the nomination of all the candidates of the regular Republican ticket, but comparatively few of the voters turned out to help make up their ticket. Quite a number of ballots were wrongly marked owing to the new form of ballot, which many did not understand. Forty-two Republicans recorded their choice of candidates in the First Precinct and seventy-two in the Second, while the Democrats had a total vote of twenty-four in the First and twenty in the Second—a total of forty-four for the Republicans and thirty-three Democratic votes cast in the primaries, or one hundred and forty-seven votes cast in all out of a total registration exceeding five hundred, to which will be added the names of many not registered in the house.

Atlantic City was fought between Maria E. Keffer, regular Republican candidate for Recorder, and Edmund C. Gaskill, Independent, Keffer winning out by more than five hundred majority for re-election.
