Democratic Mismanagement Laid Bare, With Record of Broken Promises and Waste of Public Funds—G. O. P. Policies Those Which Have Always Kept Treasury in Sound Condition.

Failure of the Democratic Party to live up to its platform pledges to introduce economy and efficiency in the State administration, and the success of the Republicans in last Winter's Legislative session, in spite of bitter Democratic opposition, to bring about needed reforms...

At that time a contract with the public was proposed, that it placed in power, a program of constructive legislation would be undertaken. Definite pledges were adopted in order that the obligation should be clear and unmistakable.

The voters accepted the pledges made and at the election following changed the Democratic control in both Houses of the Legislature to a Republican majority.

The last session has more constructive work to its credit than has been accomplished in any single session in years. The work of reformation, after Democratic rule of the State for four years, could not be completed in a single session and we pledge ourselves, if elected, to continue this work of improvement and reform.

The economy and efficiency legislation, which filled in two previous Democratic Legislatures, was successfully placed on the State Department and has been effected thereby in the interest of modern businesslike regulation and control.

Bitter Democratic opposition to these reforms marked almost every legislative step. In clear violation of their promises to the people, as the Democratic party was as strongly pledged to the economy and efficiency program as were the Republicans.

FARM DEMONSTRATION DEPARTMENT NEWS

Short Courses in Agriculture—Care of Fruit Trees Injured By Weather—Curing Seed Corn—Leaf Spot.

The Short Courses in Agriculture were established eight years ago by act of the State Legislature. It was the contention of the late Governor in the State for a practical course in Agriculture that could be offered at the College, and could be available for the farm boy and the farm girl who found it possible to leave the farm and spend four years of study in order to complete a college course.

It is interesting to note that the enrollment has increased from thirty-five in 1907 to two hundred and five in 1915, and that a large percentage of the young men and the young women who attend the course find it to their advantage and interest to return to the farm.

Owing to the unusual weather conditions throughout the past year, a great deal of damage has been done to fruit trees. The growth due to an abundance of moisture during the growing season has tended to make trees top-heavy.

Due to the wet season, much of the field corn this year is not ripening uniformly. Consequently, a great deal of care should be given in the selection of ripe ears and in their proper storage for the winter.

Leaf spot attacks the foliage of the cherry and plum, causing peculiar brown spots. When severe, the leaves turn yellow and fall in very severe cases the trees may be destroyed.

DEER HUNTERS READY FOR FIRST OF SEASON DOES MAY BE KILLED

ANYTHING OVER YEAR OLD CANDIDATE FOR BUCKSHOT

Witnesses To Legal Shooting—Recommended To Avoid Straggle—Feature of New Law—Wardens On Alert—Hunting In Dark Prohibited—Hounds Still Under Ban—Game Plentiful.

Deer hunters throughout the State are offering their guns and looking over their ammunition in anticipation of the first day of the season, Wednesday next. Instead of having five days in succession, they will be allowed to kill deer this year on the first Wednesday in October and the first Wednesday in November. In addition to the regular County game wardens, special wardens will patrol the deer woods to enforce the game laws, which are very strict.

Since the accidental shooting of several gunners during the past seasons most hunters have adopted the method of wearing red caps and hats. This, apart from the fact that it is the rule this season, for with so many gunners in the woods, many of them nervous at the sight of anything moving in the brush, greatest care must be observed to prevent accidents. Notices are cautioned to keep their fingers away from the triggers of their guns until they are sure what they are aiming at is a deer and not another hunter.

The difficulty of distinguishing deer from bucks is done away with this season, for the revised law permits the killing of any deer, doe or fawn more than one year old. It is illegal to use any rifle, or firearm of any kind of a calibre smaller than twelve gauge, or to use muzzles larger than a buckshot, to hunt at any distance from the woods. Only one deer a year may be taken with any one gunner.

Notwithstanding the announcement that the burden of proof is on the magistrate or court would undoubtedly be by the old established custom in cases between the State and citizens, that the burden of proof rests upon the State to prove the guilt of the defendant. This, however, is an unusual provision and gunners should take every precaution to enable them to give the necessary proof if necessary.

Shooting before or after daylight is punishable by a fine of one hundred dollars, and is meant by daylight is not at night as the statute. The term daylight is taken by some hunters to mean the hours of sunrise to sunset as given by calendar, while others contend that it includes that period before sunrise and after sunset when objects within gunshot are clearly visible.

Notwithstanding the various deer woods indicate that there will be plenty of game this season, large herds of deer having been seen grazing in the adjacent fields. The woods north of the city, the animals making the dense woods and swamp in that vicinity their favorite ground. Gunners have been scouring the woods during the last few weeks picking out available stands, where they will take up their positions early next Wednesday morning to watch for the deer as they are driven from cover. Many of them will camp overnight to be on hand at daylight.
