DEATH CLAIMS CARMANY AFTER SUBDEN ILLNESS

Former Mayor and Alderman of Resort ---51 Years of Age.

George W. Carmany, former Mayor and Alderman of Atlantic City, died at his residence, the Fredonia Hotel, Thursday evening He was 51 years of age.

Mr. Carmany, who was one of the builders of the modern Atlantic City, had enjoyed syncilent health until about six weeks are. when he was suddenly stricken with heart trouble. He was attended by his brother, Dr. H. S. Carmany and Dr. David Berner, both of Atlantic City, and something over two weeks ago they recommended that he go to West Baden for treatment.

Mr. Carmany was accompanied on the trip re Louis Kushnie and Charles W Portner. He improved at first, but toward the latter part of last week had a relapse and Mrs. Carmany was summoned by telephone. Bhe at once went to West Baden and it was decided to bring Mr. Carmany home. He showed con siderable improvement on his return and hopes were held out for his ultimate recovery. Women Greatly Outnumber Men-Total Population 2.844,842. Since 1906 New Jersey has gained 700,308 in population, making a total of 2,844,842 residents in the State. Despite this increase, the number of males between the ages of 5 and 18 years has decreased by 28,808. On the other hand, females between the same ages have increased in numbers by 77,783. Males from 18 to 21 show increase of 21,572 and females from 18 to 21 a decrease of 1787. The ratio between the total number of males and females is virtually the same as 10 years ago, the number of white males exceeding the number of white males y about 15.090.

HOW BUENA VISTA SECURES

Mr. Charles Wray Tells Cumberland Officials Way To Do It.

At a meeting of the Boards of Education of Cumberland County, Mr. Charles Wray, for twenty-five years a member of the Board of Education of Buena Vista Township. Atlantic County, read an interesting and instructive paper on the enforcement of the compulsor; attendance law in his township. An extrac "Our Board of Education has seldom in

voked the terrors of the law. Other inducements were tried to increase attendance suc as making the schoolrooms pleasant and in teresting, forbidding corporal punishmen and introducing what is known as "busy handwork. The teachers offered inducement for regular attendance and good behavior by giving pretty cards or other inexpensive arti cles, by inscribing the names of worthy pupils on an honor roll displayed publicly in the schoolroom, by unstinted words of praise, by visits to the home of pupils, both as a means o getting in touch with parents and also to as certain the validity of excuses given for absences. The Board purchased a banner to be displayed publicly for a month in the room of the class holding the record for the best attendance during the previous school month. At the end of the term a book was presented to each pupil whose attendance record was perfect, a book not costing quite as much was given to each pupil who missed but one day, and certificates of merit to those not missing nore than five days.

"Notices were sent to offenders as in the previous school year, but the after proceedngs were varied by arresting the most flagrant and persistent offender, prosecuting him before a justice of the peace and having him fined. There was no need to arrest another.

"At the end of the school term the record showed an increase of 27,000 days in attendance. That outcome was sufficient to make each and every member of the Board an enthusiastic supporter of the fullest enforcement of the law in all the years since that time. "During November hast every school ma-

"It appears to me that the Board of Education has no greater duty than to enforce atendance at the public schools. If education is a good thing our children ought to have every opportunity to acquire it. In the matter compulsory attendance I have changed my views radically, and I am now satisfied it is one of the best measures, if not the very best, the State Board of Education has ever dvocated, and one that cannot fall to won-
