## FARM DEMONSTRATION DEPARTMENT NEWS Nearly Three Hundred Millions Exempt

Needs Of Rural Communities Subgestions.

The New Jersey State Poultry Association

Dr. Raymond Pearl, biologist of the Maine Agricultural Experiment Station, will deliver two addresses on "Breeding Poultry for Egg 'roduction," and after each lecture a discussion of this subject will be conducted by Prof. II. R. Lewis, poultry husbandman of the New Jersey Agricultural Experiment Station. This liscussion will be open to all and it is exsected that some very interesting and im portant phases of the subject will be brought out. Another feature of the program will be a lecture on poultry feeds, their manufacture, distribution, control and other relative points by W. S. Edwards, of Chicago.

During the afternoon the business meeting will be held, at which time the various committees will report. The reports of the Legislative and Co-operative Committees will be especially important. The annual election of Mrere will take place

Ministers of many religious denominations in New Jersey have requested the State Agricultural College to hold another country church conference similar to the one held last year. The conference this year will be in Kirk patrick Chapel on the college campus in New Brunswick, will begin at 1.50 p. m., Mon day, December 27, and will close Tuesday afternoon. The Theological Seminary at New Brunswick is providing rooms for ministers desiring to remain over night. Rev. S. E. Persons, of Casenovia, N. Y., will discuss his experience in making the church a community leader. Leaders in community and country church work will take part in the program. A round-table conference on "Training Men for the Rural Ministry" will be led by two repre rentatives of theological seminaries. Hundreds of ministers and laymen should find this two-days' meeting most suggestive and helpful.

The proper storage of seed corn is of greate importance to the grower than is usually realized. The agronomist of the New Jersey the seed corn may be hung in the roof of the crib. in the attic of the house near a chimney, or in the roof of a barn. In any event, good ventilation is needed for drying. After it is once dry, it is not likely that cold weather will injure its vitality unless it is placed where moisture will be reabsorbed. Dryness can be determined by feel, weight color, and appearance of the germ. By comparing mature cars of the crib with immature ears, the degree of dryness can readily be ascertained.

In the rural life conference that will be held at the New Jersey State Agricultural College at New Brunswick during the holidays, a special program is offered to boys and girls. Thursday, January 30, is the chief day and chool children from all counties of the State will be welcome. Illustrated lectures will be given and there will be an inspection of the Agricultural Experiment Station. Teachers in the public schools are urged to encourage the pupils to attend this meeting.

The amount to be raised for State school taxes this year is \$8,724,661, an increase of \$207,141 from last year. The amount appropriated for county taxes is \$12,287,838, an increase of \$000,984, and the amount for local taxes Atlantic is the only county showing a derease in ratables. The Board gives this

comment thereon: "The decrease of \$221,287 in Atlantic County is reported by the County Tax Board to be due to reductions made in assessments on public utility'corporations for the previous year. The assessments on these properties for 1914 were placed at a much higher figure than for any previous year and were based on reports filed with the Public Utility Commission, the companies having failed to furnish the statements called for by the local assessing authorities. These assessments were appealed from, with the result that the tentative assessments were materially reduced for 1914 and were practically continued so for the current year. The figures finally arrived at are still greatly in excess of ass erty prior to 1914."
