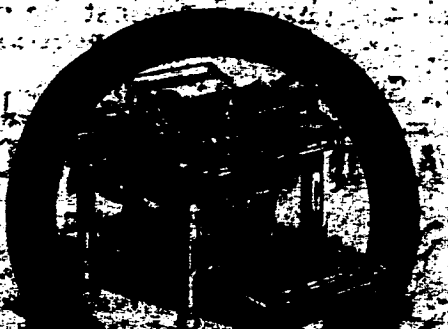

ACTIVITY OF THE GULF STREAM.

That the Gulf Stream is active six hundred miles east of New York City at a point in the Atlantic Ocean, where, according to the best authorities, it should be nearly impassable, and with such a flow as to hold back to a serious extent the drift of ice from the north, was proved by Captain Ruser, of that ship, when he arrived at Hoboken from Hamburg, Bismarck, and Dover.

Captain Ruser said that never before in his many trips across the western ocean had he observed the Gulf Stream so active, and the temperature recorded was almost phenomenal. The Molks had one weather, all of the way, and the engine-room was kept at a temperature of 100 degrees. For two days before this the ship had dropped in her speed to an almost incredible degree. 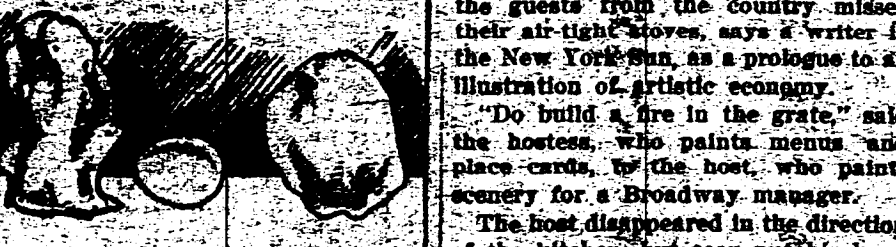

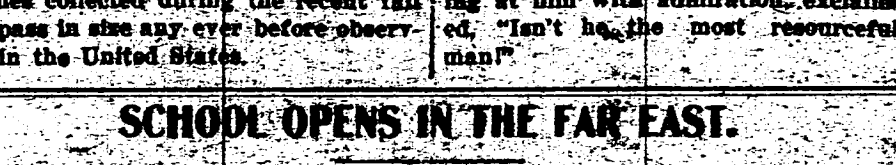
