 and runs from thence (1) North seventy six degrees and thirty nine minutes East seven chains
 in said division line to a stone in corner thence (2) North two degrees East five chains to a stone
 for a corner thence (3) North seventy six degrees and thirty nine minutes East four chains eighty
 links to a stake and stone standing in a cypress thence (4) South two degrees East fifteen
 chains and five links to the second line of the original survey thence (5) along said
 line to the old Gun ten corner aforesaid in Negro Creek Branch thence (6) South forty four
 degrees and fifteen minutes West one chain to a cedar stake and corner to William Henry's lot
 in place by the South westerly side of a causeway over said branch thence (7) along the line
 of William Henry's part being the homestead place to the place of Beginning containing
 twenty nine acres & forty hundredths of an acre - Item 4th I do give and bequeath unto
 my daughter Mary Weeks wife of Franklin Weeks the following described tract adjoining
 that bequeathed to my son Isaac and beginning at his second corner in the division
 line aforesaid and runs first along said division line eight chains to a stake & stone
 in a cypress for a corner in said division line thence (2) North two degrees East five chains
 to a stone for a corner thence (3) North seventy six degrees & thirty nine minutes East
 eight chains to a stake (5th) corner thence (4th) along his line to the place of Beginning
 containing seven acres more or less Item 5th I give & bequeath unto my daughter
 Elizabeth Simon's wife of William Simon the following described parcel or tract ad-
 joining my daughter Mary's lot & Beginning at her second corner thereof in the
 division line aforesaid and runs from thence (1st) along the division line eight
 chains and two by eight links to the easterly corner thereof thence (2) North twenty one
 & a half degrees East three chains and eighty five links to the old corner of the second
 corner of the second line of the original survey then along the second line North four
 & one degree and forty five minutes West two chains to a stone in corner in said
 line thence (4th) South seventy six degrees and thirty nine minutes West eight chains
 & twenty five links to the 2nd corner of my daughter Mary's lot thence (4th) along the
 line of the same to the place of Beginning which said described tract she is to
 have and to hold during the term of her natural life and at her decease it
 is my will and I do hereby devise the same to my Grand son William Henry
 Henry - Item (6th) I do give and bequeath unto my daughter Susan C
 Weeks the following described lot adjoining Isaac's & Mary's lots aforesaid
 Beginning at the 1st corner of Isaac's lot standing in the North line of
 Mary's lot and runs from thence (1st) North two degrees East along the line of
 Isaac's lot to his corner in Jesse Richards line thence (2) along Richards
 line with forty one degrees & three quarters East four chains and fifty links
 to a stone for a corner thence (3rd) South two degrees West ten chains & forty five
 links to the North east corner of my daughter Mary's lot thence (4th) along
 the line of the same to the place of Beginning four acres & seventy five
 hundredths more or less - Item 7th I give and bequeath unto my daughter
 Bluma Weeks the following described lot or parcel of land bounded by the
 lot bequeathed to my daughter Elizabeth on the South and by that given by
 me to my daughter Susan on the West and by Jesse Richards land on the
 North East being the remainder of the tract which I purchased of Uiah
 Johnson not herein before divided and contains four acres and fifteen hun-
 dredths more or less - Item 8th It is my will and I do hereby bequeath unto
 my beloved wife in addition to her thirds to the homestead hereby bequeathed
 to my son William Henry five Mule skins and to my son Isaac one

Mule skin and to my son William Henry one Mule skin - Item 9th give
 and bequeath unto my daughter Susan C Weeks five Mule skins one Bed-
 stead Bed and Bedding - and to my daughter Bluma Weeks five Mule
 skins one Bedstead Bed and Bedding - Item 10th It is my will that the remain-
 ing part of my stock of neat cattle should be sold to pay my debts if necessary and
 if not that they should be equally divided between my three sons Joseph Isaac
 and William Henry - Item (11th) It is my will and I do hereby bequeath & de-
 vise all of my personal property not herein before divided unto my beloved
 wife Mary Weeks during the term of her widowhood and at her decease it is
 my will that she shall dispose of one half of the household goods as she may
 think proper and the other half I do hereby give to my son William Henry
 together with all of my personal property not herein before divided and
 I do further will and direct that my beloved wife Mary Weeks shall have the
 choice of any two of the rooms in my house as long as she remains my
 widow - I also give unto her my equal undivided half of the Elder Point
 tract of Meadow and at her decease to accord to my son William Henry and it
 is my will and I do give and bequeath unto my two sons Joseph and Isaac
 the one third part of Elder Point fish place together with the privilege of fishing
 on the tract of Meadow at Elder Point and also all of my right and title
 to a piece of Cedar Swamp in what is called the Morfe Swamp lying below
 the long crossway through said Swamp lastly I do hereby appoint my sons
 Joseph & Weeks my Executor and my wife Margaret Weeks Executrix to this my
 last will & testament.
