Wilson Executors as aforesaid, and I do hereby command and require you to make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, as far as you may know, or can ascertain them, and exhibit the same into the Register's Office, in and for the said County of Northampton, within thirty days from the date hereof, and also a just account and settlement thereof within one year from the date hereof, or when thereto legally required.

In Testimony Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the seal of said office, dated at Easton, in the County of Northampton aforesaid, the sixth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine

Be it remembered, that I, John L. Wilson of the City of Easton, being of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, and considering the uncertainty of life, do therefore, make, ordain, publish and declare, this to be my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made, in manner and form following, that is to say:-

First: I direct that my body be decently interred according to the sites and ceremonies of the Methodist Church, and that my funeral be conducted in a manner corresponding with my estate and situation in life, and that my hereinafter named executor cause to be erected a neat marble slab to mark my last resting among the dead.

Second: I do give devise and bequeath to my brother Lorenzo D. Wilson the sum of two hundred dollars, to my brother Jacob Wilson one hundred and fifty dollars, and to my brother Jerome M. Wilson one hundred and fifty dollars, to be paid to

to them by my Executors as soon as convenient.  
 Fourth: I give devise and bequeath all the rest and residue of my estate, real, personal and mixed, and all my right title and interest in the business of Wilson Brothers to my beloved mother, Margaret Wilson, and my two sisters Maria, and Clara S. Wilson, and it is also my desire that they continue the partnership business with my surviving brothers in my place and stead, leaving the management of said business to my said brothers, but in all other respects enjoying all the rights and privileges of the firm, at the death of my mother, I desire that her one third, shall go to my two sisters named above, in other words, I hereby give devise and bequeath the said one third interest in the business above named, to my said mother during her life and at her death to my said two sisters or the survivor of them, and as to all the rest and residue of my estate, real, personal or mixed of whatsoever nature or kind or wheresoever situate at the time of my decease, I do hereby give devise and bequeath to my said mother and sisters, share and share alike.

And lastly, I do make constitute and appoint my trusted brothers, L. D. Wilson, Frank Wilson and James E. Wilson to be the Executors of this my last will and testament.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto subscribed my name, and affixed my seal this thirteenth day of January 1888 signed, sealed, published and declared by the testator above named, as and for his last will and testament, in the presence of us who have hereunto affixed and subscribed our names at his request, in his presence, and in the presence of each other.
