

Eighth - I give and bequeath to my niece Julia W. L. B. Kerplank, the picture painted by their grand-  
father with the chair of the family.

Ninth - I wish a scarf pin to be made of my ag-  
namanering, and given as a memento to my beloved  
nephew Ellis Lewis Campbell.

Tenth - To my niece A. M. S. Campbell, wife of  
Ellis Lewis Campbell I give and bequeath my  
leashmere shawl, given me by my mother.

Eleventh - I give and bequeath to my niece  
Katharine Malcolm Lewis the large Bible, in two  
volumes, which belonged to my mother.

Twelfth - I give and bequeath the silver pit-  
cher willed me by my father, to Ellis Lewis, grand-  
son of my father's brother, Eli.

Thirteenth - I give and bequeath to my husband  
James Wiley, all my clothing, jewelry, ornaments, pic-  
tures, china, glass, books, silver, for his use during  
his natural life, with the same freedom of use as  
though they were his absolutely, even to the right  
of giving them away, should he desire, during his life,  
and with the right to dispose of them by will.  
In case he should fail to make any specific dis-  
position of them by will, on his death they are to go  
to my two sisters, Juliet S. L. Campbell and Josephine  
Lewis, to be divided between them in such equitable  
manner as they may determine.

Fourteenth - I give, bequeath and devise to my  
husband, James Wiley, absolutely, all the residue  
of my estate, real, personal and mixed, which I now  
possess, or which I may hereafter acquire.

Lastly I appoint my husband James Wiley  
sole executor of this my last will and testament,  
without giving security or returning any inventory.

In witness whereof I, Annie Lewis Wiley, the  
Testatrix, have to this my will, set my hand and  
seal this 26th. day of August A.D. one thousand eight  
hundred and ninety. (1891).

I, Annie Lewis Wiley, the within named testatrix do  
hereby make and publish this codicil, to be added  
to my last will and testament, bearing date the  
sixth day of August A.D. One thousand eight hundred  
and ninety, in manner following to wit:-

Whereas in clause third of my said  
will I have made certain provisions relative to  
the making of a last payment on a Rectory for  
Trinity Church, Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, and  
whereas I am contemplating making a sub-  
scription for the payment of a rectory for said  
church, now therefore, I hereby direct that  
any subscription I may make for the payment  
for a Rectory for Trinity Church Bethlehem Pa,  
which shall remain unpaid at the time  
of my death, shall be paid out of the money  
which I have on deposit at the Philadelphia  
Saving Fund Society, and all parts of said  
third clause in my will, inconsistent here-  
with are revoked. In other respects the terms  
of the bequest of said fund stated in the will  
are to be followed. But if, at the time of  
my death, the said Trinity Church shall own  
a Rectory wholly paid for, then I direct that the  
Incorporated Trustees of the Diocese of Central  
Pennsylvania, on coming into possession of the money,  
shall at once, transfer the same to the endow-  
ment fund of the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania,  
without waiting for the nineteen years (as stated  
in said will) to elapse. In all other cases the  
provisions of the will, regarding the fund or de-  
posit at the Philadelphia Saving Fund Society,  
are to be followed.
