I give and bequeath to my Coachman George Ruth if he should be in my employ at the time of my death Two hundred and fifty dollars, he lives in Bethlehem Penna.)

I give and bequeath to my niece Bella Wiley and to my niece May Wiley (they are daughters of my brother Henry B. Wiley living in Los Angeles California) Two hundred (\$200) and fifty each (as a remembrance of me.)

I give and bequeath to my Brother Henry B. Wiley (now living in Los Angeles California) Fifty \$50,000 thousand dollars.

I give and bequeath to my sister in Law Miss Josephine Lewis, (daughter of the Hon. Ellis Lewis late Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.) for her nursing attention and nursing my dear wife through nine months of sickness and for my regard and esteem for her, Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)

I leave Two thousand (\$2,000) dollars with my Executors for the purpose of keeping the burial lot of the Hon. Ellis Lewis in Woodland Cemetery in which my dear wife buried and in which lot next to my wife's grave I expect to be buried. The interest of the Two thousand only is to be used for the purpose of keeping in good condition and repairs the lot above mentioned.
