Provided however, and it is hereby expressly understood any thing hereinbefore to the contrary notwithstanding that should it be impossible for my said trustees to carry out the provisions of this Trust or hereinafter set out or should the same for any reason fail or become void, then and in such case I give, devise and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder, real, personal and mixed unto my executors and trustees hereinafter named, their heirs and assigns.

And seventh: I give in addition to the legacies hereinafore given and direct my executors to pay the same to Mrs. Lily Hopkinson two thousand dollars, to Dr. Robert M. Wharton two thousand dollars.

And lastly I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my friends G. Washington Powell and William Gorman, executors and trustees of this my last will and testament, and in case of their death then I appoint the Commonwealth Title Insurance and Trust Company of the city of Philadelphia.
