


sum in cash as well make up the sum of fifteen thousand dollars. Thirdly: If my wife should die before me, and her daughter Clara B. Stanley, be living, then I give, devise and bequeath to the said Clara B. Stanley my residence No. 36 S. Pennsylvania Avenue this City, with all the furniture of every kind and nature therein contained; or if she prefers the sum of twenty thousand dollars, with the privilege also of taking whatever she may choose to select of the table ware, ornaments of all kinds, pictures, table and bed linen, three full sets of bedroom furniture, piano, writing desk and any other article of furniture, excepting carpets. I make this apparently large provision for her because her mother has contributed largely to the purchase of our present residence and this amount given to her daughter is not greatly in excess of the same. Fourthly: If unfortunately I survive my step-daughter and my wife, I direct my Executors to pay to my wife's sister, Mrs. Jane A. Tracy, 309 Euclid Ave., Cleveland Ohio, the sum of ten thousand dollars, to be under her absolute control. I am sure she will dispose of it among my wife's kindred in about the same manner as my wife herself would do. Fifthly: I give to my brother Rev. Edwin S. Williams, of Saratoga, Cal., to my sister Anna B. Williams of the City of New York and to my sister Amelia J. Court, wife of William B. Court of Montreal, Canada, the sum of one thousand dollars each. Sixthly: All the residue and remainder of my estate of whatever kind wherever situate I give, devise and bequeath to my sister Anna B. Williams I request her to use five thousand dollars of what she receives from this bequest in purchasing an annuity from some responsible life insurance company, payable quarterly or semi-annually for the benefit of my sister Amelia J. Court. This is not mandatory but my urgent request. If my sister Anna B. Williams, be not living at the time this Will takes effect, I direct my Executors to pay the said residue of my estate mentioned in this item to my wife subject to the above request that an annuity of five thousand dollars be purchased for my sister as above expressed. Seventhly: If my beneficiaries under this Will prefer they may omit the probate of this Will and carry out its provisions the same as if it had been probated. Lastly: I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Walter A. Eggleston of Minneapolis, Minn., Executor of this Will so far as its probate or execution shall be necessary in the state of Minn. And for all other purposes and places of execution I do hereby constitute and appoint my sister Anna B. Williams of New York City (or if she be not living at the time of my decease, then my wife Helen E. Williams) and Allen B. Benedict of

Atlantic City, N.J., Executors of this my last Will and Testament with full power to sell and dispose of any or all parts of my estate at either public or private sale, and I desire it fully understood that I do not wish my Executors or any or either of them to be compelled to give security or enter into bonds for the proper management of my estate in any State in the United States or elsewhere. And be it known that this my last Will and Testament is signed, sealed, published and declared in duplicate instruments. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty ninth day of November, in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred and Ninety eight.


