Baker of Atlantic City, New Jersey, and the Guarantee Trust Company, a corporation existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of New Jersey, are held and firmly bound unto the Ordinary of the State of New Jersey, in the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, lawful money of said State, to be paid to the said Ordinary, his successors or assigns; to which payment well and truly to be made the said George B. Baker, Gilbert L. Baker and the said Guarantee Trust Company bind themselves, their heirs, executors and administrators and successors jointly and severally firmly by these presents.

Baker late of the County of Atlantic, hath died having first made her last will and testament in writing, which hath been duly proved before the Surrogate of said County of Atlantic, and the same entered of record, and whereas, said testatrix hath appointed the said George B. Baker and Gilbert L. Baker and directs that they shall enter into bond for the faithful performance of their duties as executors thereof, to whom letters testamentary are about to be granted thereon, by the Surrogate of said County of Atlantic.

Now Therefore, if the said George B. Baker and Gilbert L. Baker the executors named in the said last will and Testament of the said Mary H. Baker deceased, do well and truly administer all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits, moneys and effects which have or shall come to the hands of the said executors or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for the said executors and all other, the estate, real and personal, of the said Mary H.
