

Dollars, to be used exclusively for the purpose of educating him. Provided however upon reaching his majority the said sum or so much thereof as shall remain in this behalf unexpended shall be given to him absolutely, and I do hereby appoint my executrices hereinafter named his guardians during his minority.

Fourth. I give, bequeath and devise all the residue and remainder of my estate, real, personal or mixed which shall belong to me at the time of my death (share and share alike) to my said wife Lida S. Babcock to my said daughter Charlotte A. Babcock, and my said son Reuben S. Babcock, Jr. their heirs and assigns forever. And I hereby direct and declare that the devices and bequests made in and by this last will and testament to my said wife are to be by her received in lieu of dower.

I hereby nominate and appoint my said wife Lida S. Babcock and my said daughter Charlotte A. Babcock executrices of this my last will and testament.
