Harriet J. Babcock widow of John M. Babcock, late of the County of Atlantic deceased, having presented her petition to this Court verified by her affidavit setting forth that the said John M. Babcock, lately died seized of land and real estate situate in the County aforesaid and that she has caused the application to be published in the Atlantic Journal a newspaper published in this County at least four weeks or a week previous to this date, it is ordered by the Court that William Lake, Joseph H. English and Joseph Scull, three discreet and disinterested freeholders in the said County be and they hereby are appointed Commissioners to admeasure and set off as speedily and conveniently may be one third part of the said lands and real estate as the said widow dower and that they make a full report of all their proceedings with the distresses and courses of the lands so assigned and allotted by them to the widow for her dower and amount of their charges to this Court at the next or some subsequent term thereof according to the form of the Statute in such case made and provided.
