

dollars for his benefit and upon his arrival - at such age to pay him the first installment of Twenty five (25) dollars and the same sum on each succeeding quarter until he receives the full amount together with the accrued interest.

Third: I give and bequeath to my executors hereinafter named the sum of twenty five hundred (2500) dollars in trust to invest the same in good securities and to pay the income semi-annually to my step father Caleb Muncy during his natural life and upon the death of my said step father the said principal sum of twenty five (2500) dollars to become part of my residuary estate.

Fourth: I direct my executors to pay the bequest to my step father free from all legacy duty or tax.

Fifth: I give, devise and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder of my estate both real and personal to my son James Hatt and to his heirs and assigns forever.

Sixth: I hereby authorize and empower my executors to sell at public or private sale, any or all of my real estate and to give good and valid deeds thereof.

Seventh: I hereby revoke all other wills and codicils by me heretofore made.

Eighth: I hereby appoint my son James Hatt and my brother-in-law Peter M. Hatt, Executors and Trustees of this my last will and testament and I order and direct that my said executors shall not be required to give bonds conditioned for the faithful performance of their duties.
