Item All the rest residue and remainder of my Estate real personal or mixed whatsoever and wheresoever I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Ann Beckett her heirs and assigns absolutely forever. And lastly I nominate and appoint my said wife Mary Ann Beckett and my friend William Zeiss to be the Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and making void and of no effect all other Will or Wills at any time heretofore made by me and declaring these presents only to be and contain my last Will and Testament.
