

Swanson Street in the City of Philadelphia, shall and may be carried on and conducted by my wife Emma M. Tomson, Martin E. Brigham and Harry K. Buck, under the name of C. L. Tomson & Co. and all my interest in said business firm of C. L. Tomson & Co. with all the buildings, machinery, horses, wagons and fixtures of every kind, I direct my executors hereinafter named to let remain in the said business until the firm of C. L. Tomson & Co. shall have paid into my estate the aforesaid sum of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars, when I do give devise and bequeath all my interest in said business with all the buildings, machinery, horses, wagons and fixtures of every kind to Martin E. Brigham, Harry K. Buck and Emma M. Tomson. It is my will that my wife Emma M. Tomson, Martin E. Brigham and Harry K. Buck shall be equal partners in said business, sharing in equal proportions, the loss or gain in said business, provided however that the said Martin E. Brigham and Harry K. Buck shall each receive Twenty-five Dollars per week in consideration of their giving their whole time and attention to the business, which said Fifty Dollars shall be chargeable to the general expense account of said business. In case either of the above named persons should wish to withdraw from the firm, he or she shall have the right and privilege to do so by having a just and true account taken of his or her interest in said business provided that no party shall withdraw so much of the capital at any one time as to endanger the success of the business. In the case of the death of any party, his or her interest shall be determined in the same manner. I do further order and direct that at my death there shall be an inventory and appraisement made of all the property, real personal or otherwise belonging to the firm of C. L. Tomson & Co. so as to determine the interest of each partner.

Item. I give devise and bequeath to my wife Emma M. Tomson, the premises in which we now live, No. 502 North Seventh Street Philadelphia, with all the furniture and everything therein contained. I do also give, devise and bequeath to my said wife, Emma M. Tomson, the brick factory and lot of ground situate at the corner of Brown and Vine Streets, Philadelphia and the real estate as follows:

I do further give, devise and bequeath to my said wife, Emma M. Tomson, all my interest in mines, machinery, real estate and everything belonging to me in the County of Huerfano and State of Colorado, and also I give devise and bequeath to my said wife, Emma M. Tomson, the real estate,

including the glass factory, situate at or near the City of Denver, State of Colorado, said real estate consisting of forty-two lots of land, with two large brick buildings, three dwelling houses and furnaces, together with all the machinery, moulds and everything belonging or appertaining thereto.

Item. I give devise and bequeath to my executors hereinafter named their successors and assigns, the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars, in trust nevertheless upon the following uses and purposes, that is to say: to invest the same safely in good mortgage, and pay the net income thereof to my daughter, Cassandra until she arrives at the age of thirty years, at which time, I direct the aforesaid principal sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars shall be paid and given to her absolutely and freed and discharged of the trust. It is my will that neither the principal nor the income of said Fifty Thousand Dollars during the continuance of this trust shall be liable or attachable in any way for the debts, contracts or engagements of my said daughter. Should my said daughter die before arriving at the age of thirty years, leaving lawful issue her surviving, I do give, devise and bequeath the said sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars to such surviving issue absolutely. In the event of my said daughter dying before arriving at the age of thirty, without leaving lawful issue her surviving, then I do order and direct the said Fifty Thousand Dollars shall be divided equally between the children of my sister Mary Aggar living at the determination of the before mentioned trust.

Item. I give devise and bequeath to my sisters Mary Aggar, Kate Myer, Margaret Bowler, and Abigail McCharston, the sum of Five Thousand Dollars each and to the children of my deceased sister Ann Woodward the sum of Five Thousand Dollars and to the child of my deceased sister Rebecca the sum of One Thousand Dollars, provided however that these amounts shall not be payable until my executors shall or may have money in their hands belonging to my estate which may be spared from the business of C. L. Tomson & Co. I direct my executors as soon as they have any money belonging to my estate which may be spared from the aforesaid business to pay to any of my sisters, at account of her legacy, any amount however small, which she may desire for immediate use.

Item. All the rest, residue, and remainder of my estate, I give devise and bequeath to my executors hereinafter named in trust nevertheless, to invest the same and apply the net income thereof to the care of the sick and worn out employed of the firm of C. L. Tomson & Co. as long as the business is conducted under the name of C. L. Tomson & Co. When the said business is no longer conducted under that name, then I do give, devise and
