First. I direct my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid as soon after my decease as possible.

Item: I give and bequeath to my Executors and Trustees hereinafter named the sum of One hundred Dollars (\$100.) to be by them invested and the income and principal thereon, I direct my Executors and Trustees to pay to my grandson, Guybert B. Wroon upon his attaining the age of twenty-one years.

Item: All the rest of my estate real personal and mixed, including my house and lot No. 5 South New Hampshire Avenue, Atlantic City, New Jersey, and my house and lot, at No. 121 North Second Street, Camden, New Jersey, I give, devise and bequeath to my Executors and Trustees, hereinafter named, to be by my Executors and Trustees, equally divided between my three children, Francis B. Wood, Laura B. Wroon and Maria Dungan Campion.

Item: I hereby authorize and empower my Executors and Trustees to lease or sell my real estate at public or private sale without any liability on the part of the purchaser to see to the application of the purchase money and I devise said real estate to them in fee for that purpose.

Item: After the death or marriage of my daughter, Maria Dungan Campion I direct my Executors and Trustees to sell my house and lot No. 124 South Rhode Island Avenue, Atlantic City, New Jersey, and divide the proceeds equally among my surviving children and the lawful issue of any deceased child of mine it being my intention that in each division of money or property the children of any deceased child of mine shall receive his or her parents share.

I hereby nominate and appoint Ernest H. Troth and Maria D. Campion, Executors and Trustees of this my last Will and Testament.
