Gave and bequeath to Della Addison, granddaughter of my brother Samuel S. Addison, the sum of Fifty Dollars.

Gave and bequeath to Arthur G. Addison and John A. Addison, grandsons of my brother William Addison, the sum of Fifty Dollars each.

Gave and bequeath to Lillie Tusamfeld, granddaughter of my brother Samuel S. Addison, the sum of Fifty Dollars.

Gave and bequeath to Harry Addison, grandson of my brother Samuel S. Addison, the sum of Fifty Dollars.

Gave and bequeath to my niece Marab Foxwood, all my books, pictures, wearing apparel and all the household furniture which I have not heretofore disposed of. I also wish that my niece Marab Foxwood shall be informed of my death as soon as it takes place. Provided she is not with me at the time, she shall be sent for and hold possession of the house, No. 30 West Lafayette Avenue, until such time as my estate shall be settled up she shall not be required to pay any rent while she is in the house but stay and take care of the house and affairs until such time as the estate is settled.

And direct that the rest and residue of my estate shall be sold and the proceeds thereof be equally divided among the following persons:

The children of my late niece Alice C. Parks. The children of my niece Marab Foxwood. The children of my nephew Samuel A. Downs and the children of James Green shore and share alike.

I hereby constitute and appoint Williams S. Elmer and Samuel A. Downs, the sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament. And further do request, that they be not required to bond in the performance of their duties.

First: I hereby, in addition to that which I have heretofore given to my grand-niece Annie Gladys, give unto her my note dated July 31st 1906 and record among the said records of Baltimore City in Sub R. D. No. 261 Folio 216 & c. for Eight hundred Dollars from my Joseph S. Smith and wife and hereby will that my Executors shall assign same to her.

Second: Inasmuch as the grand-son mentioned in my said Will as going to my nephew Samuel A. Downs for life and then to his daughter Mary Ann Downs, has been redeemed, I desire to substitute in place of same, (to be certain at least) my first mortgage for five hundred dollars on a house on Roland Heights Avenue in Baltimore of Baltimore County, and hereby will that same shall go to my said Nephew for life and then to his daughter Mary Ann Downs. I hereby revoke any codicil to my said Will executed prior hereto and in other respects hereby republish my said Will, with the addition of this the only proper codicil thereto.
