ITEM 11. All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate I give, devise and bequeath unto my niece Mary W. Whitney of Baltimore, Maryland.

ITEM 12. The bequests and devises contained in Items numbered 3 to 11 inclusive are not to be operative in the event I am survived by my said wife and daughter, or either of them, and in the event I am survived by them or either of them then my estate is to pass as is provided in Items 1 and 2 of this Will.

LASTLY: I nominate, constitute and appoint my said wife, Ida Craig Wilcox and my said daughter, Mary A. Wilcox and the survivor to be the executors of this my said Last Will and Testament, but in the event of their death prior to mine, then I appoint Annie Wilcox, daughter of the late Samuel Wilcox, to be the executor of this my said Last Will and Testament.
