

Be It Remembered, That I, Amelia F. Becker, of the City of Philadelphia, widow, being of sound, disposing mind, memory and understanding, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and former following:

Imprimis: I direct that all my just debts be paid as soon as convenient after my decease.

Item: I give, devise and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, real, personal and mixed unto my son, Edward B. Becker, absolutely, if living at the time of my decease.

In case I survive my said son, then I will as follows;

FIRST: I give and bequeath unto John Baxter, my interest in the real estate business conducted under the name of Ellwood Becker.

Second: I give and bequeath unto my sister, Mrs Catharine Tismar, one thousand dollars if living at the time of my decease if not, then I give and bequeath the same to her daughter if living. If both be deceased, I direct that this legacy shall revert to my residuary estate.

Third: I give and bequeath unto John Logan Steward, five hundred dollars; unto Catharine E. Griffith, one thousand dollars; unto William E. Ulery, John H. Hiltner and Isadore H. Back, five hundred dollars, each, in case they are in my employ at the time of my decease, otherwise the legacy to any of the four persons last named in this clause shall revert to my residuary estate.

FOURTH: I give and bequeath unto F. Ellwood Langenheim, Agnes B., his wife, and their child Frederick Hugh Langenheim one thousand dollars each. The legacy to the last named not to be paid to him until he arrives at the age of twenty-five years and the Republic Trust Company of this City, to act as his testamentary guardian as to this fund.

Fifth: All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, I give devise and bequeath unto my friends, Elizabeth D. Krips and John Baxter in equal shares.

Lastly: I nominate, constitute and appoint my son, Edward B. Becker, executor of this will in case he survives me. In case he does not survive me and in which case only that part of my foregoing will following the clause designated ITEM Shall become effective, I nominate constitute and appoint the said John Baxter and Republic Trust Company executors of this my will, with full power and authority to sell any or all my real estate (Amelia F. Becker) either at public or private sale, without any liability on the part of any purchaser to see to the application of the purchase money.
