Caroline E. Wilson, a lunatic } Order to show cause.

Jennie Wilson, guardian of Caroline E. Wilson, a lunatic, having filed her petition, wherein it is charged that she Annie Wilson has heretofore advanced moneys, necessaries and rendered services on account of the lunatic for her care, support and maintenance and for the preservation and benefit of said lunatic's estate, beyond the ability of said lunatic to pay for the same out of her personal estate or any other estate which has come into the hands of the petitioner as guardian or any other person and belonging to the said lunatic;

That said lunatic has no personal estate but does own a small interest in a lot of land or real estate in Camden County in this state and a lot of land on the west side of Kentucky Avenue between Pacific Avenue and the Boardwalk in Atlantic City in this county and on which there is a certain mortgage of ten thousand dollars; that said lunatic has no money to pay the interest, tax or other expenses or to purchase necessaries or to pay for her support, care and maintenance or to supply medical attention; that to do all of which the said Annie Wilson has from time to time heretofore advanced for such purposes various sums of money upon different dates and that the said Caroline E. Wilson is now indebted to the said Annie Wilson for moneys advanced as aforesaid to the amount of twelve thousand eight hundred and fifteen dollars and eighteen cents; that said guardian prays permission to sell the lands and premises situate on the said Kentucky Avenue in Atlantic City aforesaid in order to pay the said debt.

It is therefore, on this seventeenth day of April, nineteen hundred and seven, ordered that all of the parties now interested, to wit, all of the children and heirs at law of the said Caroline E. Wilson, show cause before this court on Thursday the sixteenth day of May A.D. nineteen hundred and seven, at 10 A.M. at Court House in Orange-Camden in said County of Atlantic State of New Jersey, why the said court should not inquire into and make a full investigation of the situation and

circumstances of the said lunatic's real and personal estate and of the just debts owing by her and of the advances which have been made on her account and of the services rendered for her and for her estate, from time to time, and, if found necessary so to do, to order said guardian sell the said lands of the said lunatic in such parts and in such manner as shall seem to this court to be best and the advances above mentioned paid and to do and perform such other things as may be required to be done and it is further ordered that a copy of this order be served upon each of the children and heirs at law of the said Caroline E. Wilson by mailing to each of them a copy hereof (which may be uncertified) addressed to them at their last known post office address, with postage prepaid thereon within five days from the date hereof.
