Edna North White, being duly sworn according to law on her oath says that she is the ward of the West Jersey Trust Company by virtue of an order of the Orphans' Court of Atlantic County made on the third day of July, nineteen hundred and eight, and that she is the person named in the petition thereto answered; that she has read the said petition and knows the contents thereof, and that the matters and things therein set forth are true.

This affiant further says that she has long realized the necessity of being able to earn her own living and that she cannot be supported from the income of her said property; that she has no other properties or securities other than those mentioned in the said petition, and no other means of income at this time than the income and interest therefrom; that this affiant has been long anxious to take up a course in physical training so as to fit her to become an instructor in physical training; that physical instructors are able to obtain from fifteen to twenty-five dollars a week, and that this affiant believes that if she should become such an instructor she would be able to earn her own living in a way which would be most satisfactory and agreeable to her.

This affiant further says that with the consent of the West Jersey Trust Company her guardian, she has commenced a course of physical training at Drexel University, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, which course she commenced early in October and has continued therein; that affiant likes the work and is satisfied that she can become proficient therein and will be able upon graduation to earn her own living as an instructor of physical training, and affiant says that she is anxious to continue in said course of instruction.

And this affiant further says that she is living with a relative at 2118 Newpark Street, Philadelphia, where she pays four dollars a week board and lodging, which is much lower than she would have to pay if boarding elsewhere; that it is necessary for her to travel to and from Drexel University in the street railway, at a small daily expense; that she believes it is impossible to live on any more an economical basis than that indicated in the statement of expenses in the said petition; that the said petition is presented to the court at her request and that she is very desirous that the order required should be granted and the principal and interest of her securities applied in the manner prayed for in the said petition.

And it is further Ordered that the action of the said guardian in sending the said ward to Drexel University in October, nineteen hundred and eight, and in paying the expense thereof, is hereby approved.
