Decree

George W. Harmon, Executor of the estate of Martha Sibbons Williams, deceased, having filed his final account, dated the eighteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and eight whereby it appears that there is available for the payment of the debts and expenses of settlement of the estate the sum of six thousand and five hundred and fifty five dollars and fifty five cents, and it further appearing that said sum of six thousand and five hundred and fifty five dollars and fifty five cents, included, inter alia, the sum of One Hundred and fifty Dollars, realized from the sale by Executor of the real property specifically devised by the will of the deceased to one Charles E. Shaw, and the sum of Six Thousand Two Hundred Dollars, realized from the sale by executor of the real property specifically devised by the will of the deceased to Charles E. Shaw, such sale of the specifically devised real estate being necessary by reason of the personal and residuary estate of the deceased being insufficient to pay the debts against and expenses of the settlement of said estate, and

It further appearing by said account that there are unpaid debts against the estate and expenses incident to the settlement thereof, to the date of said account and including a commission fee amounting the sum of Five Thousand Four Hundred Forty seven Dollars and twenty cents, and

It further appearing that the said account was filed on the files in the office of the Surrogate of Atlantic County, on the twenty fifth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and was duly audited by the Surrogate of Atlantic County, aforesaid, and copy being made that notice of the inventory of said Executor to settle the said account has been given according to law and

It further appearing that the adjudication of said account has been adjudged and continued from time to time and to the date hereof, and no cause appearing to the contrary.

It is on this twenty third day of January, A.D. 1909, one thousand nine hundred and nine, ordered, adjudged and decreed that the said account in all things stand approved as filed and reported except that the item included in the unpaid debts therein "State of New Jersey for collateral inheritance tax, including tax against Eliza Cook, 12 1/2 Tennessee Avenue, one hundred and twenty two dollars and eighty cents; against Mrs. W. Moore, 106 7/8 Tennessee Avenue, one hundred fifty three dollars and twenty seven cents; against Charles E. Shaw, 616 Atlantic Avenue, two hundred forty six dollars and six cents; against Benj. Capps, 1001 Atlantic Avenue, twenty five dollars and twenty seven cents and interest on said several sums of Forty one dollar and thirty nine cents amounting in all to Six thousand eight hundred and thirty one cents be excluded from said account, to be paid by the persons against whom the same is assessed and that the said Executor pay the debts and expenses set out in said account with the interest allowance is follows:
