In the matter of the Estate of Ebenezer Somers, deceased

Whereas, an order having been made in the above entitled matter on the twentieth day of September, nineteen hundred and eight directing Frances H. Somers, the then executor of the estate of Ebenezer Somers, deceased commanding the said executor to advertise for sale within fifteen days of the date of said order in the manner prescribed by law certain real estate of which the said Ebenezer Somers died seized; and further commanding that the said Frances H. Somers, executor as aforesaid, enter into security in the manner required by law and to be approved by this Court in the sum of fifteen hundred dollars; and

Whereas, the said Frances H. Somers, neglected, failed and refused to advertise said real estate for sale within the time prescribed by said order, and also neglected, failed, and refused to enter into security in the said sum of fifteen hundred dollars, whereupon the said Court did by another order dated the twelfth day of January, nineteen hundred and nine revoke the letters testificatory granted to the said Frances H. Somers and removed her from the aforesaid office; and

Whereas, the said Court did by another order dated the twenty sixth day of January, nineteen hundred and nine appoint Clifton C. Shinn, substitute administrator of said estate with full power to proceed in the matter in accordance with all orders and decrees heretofore made in said cause upon his entering into security to the ordinary in the sum of twenty five hundred dollars; and

Whereas, the said Clifton C. Shinn has entered into security to the ordinary in the said sum of twenty five hundred dollars, and that thereupon, on the fifth day of February, nineteen hundred and nine, the said Clifton C. Shinn was appointed substitute administrator of the said estate with the will annexed.

For therefore, it is on this twentieth day of February, nineteen hundred and nine ordered and decreed that the said Clifton C. Shinn, substitute administrator, as aforesaid proceed forthwith to advertise for sale, at public sale to the highest bidder in the manner prescribed by law, the lands and real estate of which the said Ebenezer Somers died seized bounded and described as follows: All the following described lands and premises situate in the Township of Tillsbury, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a peg in a corner standing in the middle of the public road leading from Aberson to Leeds Post where the line between lands formerly William Somers and Eliakin Somers intersects the same and near Henry G. English house (1) South sixty five degrees and fifteen minutes East 65 deg eight 14/100 chain leading to D Allen and Warren Somers line in the corner in the line of late John Somers (2) South twenty four degrees and forty five minutes West three 1/2 pole chains to the corner in Arch Somers line (3) North sixty five degrees and fifteen minutes West leading in Arch Somers line seven chains and forty two links to a corner in the line of late William Somers (4) South
