 in motion of John E. Casard, proctor for the said petitioner, ordered that Tobias S.  
 McConnell, a fit and discreet person, be and he is hereby appointed guardian of  
 said Joshua Reading, and of the property mentioned and described in this order.  
 And it is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that said Tobias S. McConnell  
 before entering upon the duties of his office, do enter into bond to the Judge  
 of the State of New Jersey, his successors and assigns, in the sum of Two Thousand  
 Dollars, with good and sufficient sureties to be approved by this court, conditional  
 for the faithful performance of the duties of his said office.

 An order to show cause in this matter, made on the sixth day of November,
