I, Tony Capri, aged 43 years, occupation farmer, do declare on oath that my personal description is: color white, complexion dark, height 5 feet 3 inches, weight 130 pounds, color of hair black, color of eyes brown, other visible distinctive marks none.

I was born in Messina Italy on the 12th day of March, anno Domini 1877; I now reside at Hammonton New Jersey.

I emigrated to the United States of America from Messina Italy on the vessel St. George.

foreign residence was Messina Italy; I am married; the name of my wife is Mary; she was born at Messina Italy and now resides at Hammonton New Jersey.

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to King Emmanuel 3rd King of Italy, of whom I am now a subject;

I arrived at the port of New York City, in the State of New York on or about the 2nd day of April, anno Domini 1905; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein:
