which certainly decreases the cost of the institution, and increases the value of the State treasury. Arrangements are now made with relatives to reimburse the expenses incurred on behalf of these children, but the State is left with \$1000 per week for each, and these children are deprived of the revenues it would have from them as paying patients. It is a notorious fact, that the parents are not afforded for sending children to asylums in this country, and that they have no opportunity for interested persons to the liberty of persons whom criminals do not warrant their confinement. I do not deem your mission to be whether some more stringent laws can not be provided by law.
