For while you have all these priv ileges for the money you pay, this poor privilege of selling to children is denied you. Resumption Coming.

Gold still continues to decline in the New York market and has reached a lower price than at any time since 1 62. During the hottest of the silver agitation the premium showed the firmness of the prevalent faith. in the honesty of the national government and the safety of the public bonds as investments. Perhaps, too, the course of the gold premium may be due to the fixed determination of the government and the moneyed classes to force the resumption of specie payments either at or before the time fixed by law, and so to put an end to the protracted and vexations struggle.

Confidence in the ability of the Freasary Department to do this has been unasated for a year past, and the monoyed classes have gradually been driven to the onehision that the only way to put an end to the political strine and financial unrest would be to force the crisis and pass the ordeal of resumption.

elements in our currency, finance and for eign trade. And in the course of time it will be seen that they will take their proper location and place us independent of legislation, just as has been the case in Calffornia during the whole progress of the suspension.

In a few months the gold premium will sink so low as to render the approach of resumption manifest to all. This will happen independent of the legislation or agitation of Congress - Had the national government been desirous of resumption at an earlier period it could have been reached with the same facility. In truth the difficulties of resmption have been grossly magnified and exaggerated, and the whole subject has been misrepresented and misunderstood. There is no exclusive road to resumption. Common sense is a better quide in all such matters than the most pretentious financiering. It stands to reason that as we increase our stock of gold the price must diminish and resumption become steadily more and more practicable.

Therefore the true course for the great commercial cities of the northern scaboard is to hoard gold as fast as possible and stand prepared to imitate the example of California and occupy an independent gold basis, since in so doing they would be able to command both foreign and domestic
