## Cranberry Men Meet.

The 38th Annual Meeting of the American Cranberry Growers' Association was held at the Philadelphia Bourse on Tuesday, the 28th inst.

The meeting was the most largely attended and most interesting of any that have preceded it.

The labor problem was discussed by Prof. Rockwood, of Princeton; insect enemies, by Henry J. Thayer, of Boston, and Prof. John B. Smith, Entomologist of the N. J. Experiment Station; and spraying by prosecutor Abbott, of May's Landing.

Professor Blake, of our Experiment Station, gave a history of and demonstrated how to make the Bordeaux mixture; also how not to make it.

Spraying appliances were treated by Ezra Evans and Prof. Shearer, of the Department of Agriculture, Washington, the former with reference to mechanical power and field apparatus; the latter as to the character and mechanical construction of the spray nozzle, necessary to do efficient work.

Varieties were discussed by C. D. Makepeace and A. U. Chaney.

Co-operative marketing was handled by J. J. White, President of the Growers' Cranberry Company, and E. B. Gaskell, President of the N. J. Cranberry Sales Co. The question of the brand, and who was back of it, was the principal point in the discussion.

Mr. White stood for the individual grower, and Mr. Gaskell for the Inspector.

The President's address was replete with practical suggestions and was listened to with close attention. The proceedings of the meeting will be printed in full and sent to all members of the association.

## An Interesting Letter.

(Continued from last week.)  
Next morning we struck the Bengent road proper, and in an hour of good going we were in the foot-hills. About 9:30 we asked the distance to "Two Peak," and were told that it was "two and a half miles." For the next three hours we were told, every time, "two and a half miles," and in ten minutes after the last man had told us, we ran, slam-bang into camp. Say, maybe it wasn't beautiful, right in the Bude River Canyon, mountains on either side, a day's climb high, a river as clear as crystal. There is a swimming hole in a natural rock basin, about 20 yards in diameter, and two feet from the edge in one place a sheer drop of 30 feet, the rest a solid wall of rock. Just down the river from there, are a set of boiling sulphur springs.  
Next day we had to cross eight swinging bridges, then came to a zig-zag to the crest of the range. It is about seven miles up, and when we finally hit the top we were only 500 yards forward from where we started. From there to Bagio was about seven miles more, of good enough roads, but quite steep. We made camp about 3 p. m.  
There is quite a nice military reservation there, and some very handsome residences, such as the Gor Geo summer palace, value \$5000, and some of the commissioners' residences, ranging from \$1000 to \$2500. All anyone can see there is straight up or straight down, almost no wood but pine.  
We camped two days and were compelled to go over a mile for water, so were glad to pull out again. Went to "Two Peak" laid over one day. Wish I could lay over there about three months. It is the most beautiful little valley in the world, and "game" is no name for it. One can go out and bag a deer or hog in a few minutes. Maybe that whole valley isn't beautiful! I cannot write it on paper—would take me a month. Will tell you a beauty story when I get home.  
We did not stop in Pogorumbel next day—went off to our left about 10 miles, and laid up at Bicalonan, a very pretty place, and the goo goes could not do enough for us. They grabbed our rations, cooked them, and helped us wash our horses. Then the whole town, practically, invited us to sleep in their homes. One Spanish "Meatlo" (ball breed) family had a piano, and their daughter gave three of us a very pleasant evening.  
From there we were to make camp Grigg, thus cutting out a day's march; but perhaps that day's march was not a corker! If everything had not been right (the wagons), we would have foot-elled sure. As it was, one pack mule dropped dead, and my horse almost foundered. They said we only had 25 miles to do, but it passed out—30 and felt to be 45. The troops got lost, wandering all over. We had to follow, and so took wagons over places where single horses had difficulty. At last we came up against the real thing, and had to turn back and ford a river where we were hardly three miles from home.  
Maybe every one was not mad! The wagon, finally got in at 6:30 p. m. We had been on a steady march since 5 a. m.  
Ten days after we went on a fifty mile, three day's march. I will write you of that the next time.
