Town Council Meeting.

Regular meeting on Tuesday evening, Feb. 8th. All present.

Highway Committee reported favorably on improvement of Liberty Street, and recommended that Mr. Bernshouse be employed to locate the center of said street. Adopted.

Finance and Printing reported progress on water bond. Also, that Town Treasurer be directed to deposit in both banks, - to so apportion the same as to conserve the Town's interests. Mr. Wood insisted that Treasurer divide the deposits as nearly equal as possible. A substitute was finally adopted which leaves the matter virtually same as last year. Treasurer questioned Council's right to control his deposits.

Joint meeting of Fire Committee with firemen reported, Feb. 2. Voted, that a committee of Councilmen and firemen be appointed, to inspect ladder wagon at Bridgeton, - but action was deferred one month.

Property Committee reported making a list of Town property. Find very little in the way of tools for highway work.

Resignation of A. J. Rider from the Board of Health accepted. Clerk instructed to convey to Mr. Rider the thanks of Council for his services on the said Board.

Surveyor Middleton sick and unable to be present. Clerk instructed to ask Mr. Middleton to make date for meeting with Council.

Long petition read, asking that Town money be deposited in both banks.

William Orloff asked for license to keep inn and tavern at Orchard Street and Egg Harbor Road. James Pinto, Middle Road, asked for renewal of his license. Frank Jacobs, Main Road, made same request. All referred.

Collector Davis reported \$1043.10 in delinquent taxes collected since Feb. 2, 1909. Also, list of unpaid taxes for 1909, - \$1825.70. Filed.

Collector gave a list of uncollectable taxes, - \$100.40 for 1908; \$153.80 for 1909. Referred to adjourned meeting, Feb. 15th.

Clerk reported \$18.10 received during January for theatres and other licenses.

Chief of Police reported one arrest in January, - a drunk.

Petition received for continuation of street lights out Main Road. Referred.

Subject of blankets to cover fire apparatus, and helmets for firemen referred to committee, to confer with Fire Chief. Instructed to purchase for Co. No. 2 the amount of new hose required, not to exceed 500 feet.

Bonds of Mr. Burgen, Water Commissioner, and of several Constables, were accepted.

Mr. Baker presented a resolution, which was adopted, authorizing the publication, two weeks, of all license applications, including signers.

Voted, that applications for building permits be presented to Chairman of

Fire Committee, who shall decide and notify Mayor and Clerk.

Resolution by Mr. White, that the Town pay the Water Commissioners twenty dollars per year for each fire hydrant. There being no appropriation for this expenditure, referred to the Solicitor.

Rev. Mr. Sharpe again presented his claim of \$100 for chickens killed by dogs, once turned down by Solicitor. After much debate, referred to Solicitor for further examination.

Assessors think there is a law to tax dogs 50 cents. An opinion requested from the Solicitor.

Solicitor to be asked as to Council's power to determine where and how the public money shall be deposited.

An adjourned meeting was held on Wednesday evening, 9th inst. All present except Mr. Wood.

The list of uncollectable taxes above referred to was read, considered, and the total amount abated.


