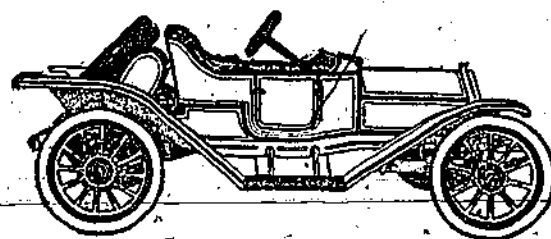

SHAVING IN ITALY

Actress, Patriot and Pioneer

Mme Modjeska Tells the Story of Her Remarkable Career.

On April 8th, 1905, Poland-born patriot who lost a great actress, and stung at a place where she had been sought to elevate dramatic art and inaugurate movements by means of which aspiring stage students could realize their ambitions. Mme. Modjeska died at East Hollywood, California, in which country she settled down after definitely leaving the stage in 1906, and a few years after Russia had published an Imperial ukase forbidding "Holandais," the famous actress, and wife of her second husband, Stanislawski, American citizen, to enter any part of the Russian territory.

And those who read, in her interesting autobiographical volume, "Memories and Impressions," the story of the horrors through which Mme. Modjeska passed in her dreim days, when Poland was striving for liberty, can well understand her indignation when she thought of the wrongs of her country—she was born at Cracow—and her tendency to the matter of sympathies of others.

In fact, it was partly on this account that she and her husband set sail for California, with the idea of forming a company, and her scheme did not prove successful. It was five years ago that Modjeska learning English and making her first appearance on the English-speaking stage at San Francisco on August 6th, 1877, as Adrienne Lecouvreur, which brought her three years later, came to this city, where under the management of the late William Barrett.

Puzzling the Public.

Concerning her appearance as Adrienne Lecouvreur in New York, Mme. Modjeska tells an amusing story. Her son-Ralph was the impresario, hearing that the public might keep away if they were led to imagine that Adrienne was other than a girl in her teens, do her best sort of passing off Modjeska for his son's sister, and to get much amusement to the lad, who was frequently accosted in the street by persons who asked him how his mother was. He always answered, "She is quite well." But one day he told some of his friends, who had known her mother, between the two, asked how his mother was. It happened once that he gave two versions were brought into contact, and the lad had to confess; and the next morning the sister exclaimed: "Nonsense! My mother does not look more than twenty-six."

"That is so," answered the boy; "I am ten years younger than my mother."

The Tragedy of the Canary.

On another occasion, when Mme. Modjeska was touring with her troupe on the stage in London, she met a little touchy secretary. Presently the bird started on a song as usual, and found Modjeska, feeling annoyed, took down the cage and put it on the stage window, she saw someone standing there, and naturally thought that the cage would be taken care of, and carried back to the proprietor. A young woman, dressed in a common dress, stepped back, and she flew to the door with a loud crash, at morning Modjeska received a letter from the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, in which she accused her having destroyed a canary ordered an innocent bird, for which she sued, according to the tuton of the society, he fined, etc., and to prove that the bird was in the cage, she was taken in penance. She was when she was taken in penance. Modjeska met again took the canary, the famous singer and friend of her youth. "A peculiar thing," she said, "in his career was that he became a very good voice, during a performance, he drank a glass of beer, and he lost his voice. It was, on the night, a parody of the vocal cords, time afterwards, however, recovered from the shock, and this incident was forgotten. It was forgotten, but it changed to a very serious one. It was decided by one of the singing teachers that his voice never a whistle, but a tone."

"What Is It?"

A smiling recollection of her first experience in England is contained in her written to her mother at the time she would laugh to see my adventures," she wrote. "Nothing but Modjeska." In letters I told long. We had been sent by to listen to the singing of the canary. The bird was having read the name, and only when it was to fly. "What Is It? Is it alive?" "You're to tell your friends that it may be some much powder, or something else, or a medicine for the throat, but you don't know it yet that of the ruler of the sea, the King Islands."

A remarkable fact concerning Mme. Modjeska is that at the very outset of her career she was told she did not possess a trace of talent. And it was only after the success of a charity concert given by her friends, that she formed themselves into a kind of cooperative company. At one time, however, Mme. Modjeska was playing all sorts of parts for less than \$20 a month, and it was some time before she began receiving that amount per week.

Real talent, like murder, will out, however, and Mme. Modjeska, by acquiring all possible knowledge from every available source, laid the foundation stone for her success. The whole of a wonderful memory, by the way, had not a little to say by her ultimate success. Here is a story which illustrates her remarkable power in directing.

Her husband, who was the editor of a newspaper in England, went home one day complaining that he could not find a stenographer to make a report of a lecture on "Spectrum Analysis," to be given in Cracov by a prominent scientist and philosopher. The editor, saying anything to her husband, Mme. Modjeska went to the lecture, returned home, sat down and wrote her own words, "sat down and wrote a resume of the lecture, with my brain on fire, though perhaps I did not know it, but with all the strange terms and foreign words, came to me as vividly as if it had been written for me in the air. Mr. S.—'s report and mine were identical, and the name was used, with Mr. S.—'s introduction."

"Queen of dramatic art, an exquisite friend, and a sincere colleague." It was in these terms that an orator referred to Mme. Modjeska on the occasion of her funeral, and the career and character of the great actress are revealed by her "Memories and Impressions," show that they are in no sense extravagant.

RESTING THE SCALP.

Rest for the scalp is imperative to overcome the loss in two hemiplegic strokes large quantities of false hair are now fashionable. For in addition to the loss of curls, puffs, etc., many curls are required to cover the bald spots in shape. THE AGE OF AN EGG.

The age of an egg can be discovered by immersing it in a solution of potassium bichromate. The color of the plant, if the egg is fresh, will be thoroughly dissolved, the egg to be tested is dropped gently into the vessel containing the solution. If the egg is only one day old it often immediately turns brown. After three days old it sinks just below the surface. After five days or older it floats. Another process was once awarded a medal in Saxony by the National Society of Poultry Breeders, and was described in Germany and Hungary. It was well known that the air-vessels in the end of the egg enlarge on the age of the egg increases. Consequently, if the egg be placed in a solution of iodine, an increase in buoyancy will have an inverse tendency to float with the longer vases. A vessel of water in which the egg is placed, and the vessel from the inclination of the egg to the horizontal, the age can be determined up to a day. A hollow egg lies flat on its side. A new-born egg floats vertically. Within four days old the egg raises itself from the horizontal as far as half an inch. At the age of twenty degrees it rises to an angle between thirty and forty degrees; when fifteen days it is about twenty degrees, while after four weeks it stands upright on the pointed

Let him hear who is so proud a member of the church, for one of the most solemn lessons of this parable is, that “the separation shall be between those who grew up together in the church.” The warning comes from the church’s camp, and even here nominal church membership is to hold a baptismal and confirmation certificate and to have one’s name on the membership roll—gives no security for his acceptance. It is in our hearts. The question is whether your roots are in the field, or so are the roots of the weeds as well as those of the wheat,—whether you are in Christ,—but whether you are in Him, whether you have the spirit of life that is in Him; whether, in short, you are a living branch of the true Vine, whose spirit and strength flow into you—and bring forth fruit.

That is the question; and it will be answered in that day.

A man is not necessarily fat because he has a boundless stomach.

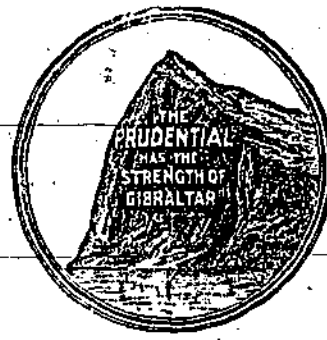
BABY PRINCE GOES AIDS SOCIETY

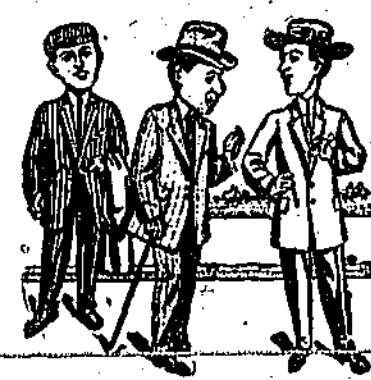

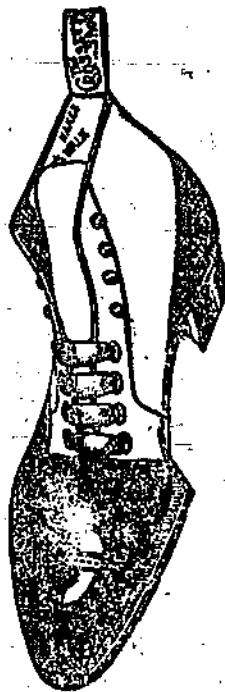
