Cranberry Culture in Now Jersey

Mr. A. B. CRANDELL, New York, send to the Country Gentleman an interest-Some friends to the cranberry district of Ocean County, New Jersey, in September last. They took steamer from New York to Port Monmouth, railroad to Tom's River, and thence a drive of fifteen miles "in one of the bye-ways which abound in the vast forests of New Jersey wit wound like a treep walk, was so narrow that the bushmboole and the limbs of the there were no houses to be seen, and no and most productive bog in the country. space of twenty acres or more around it. The land is a sandy loam, and in quality not much above the medium of ordinary South Jersey soil. The clearing was made four or five years ago. There is now a vinc yard of six acres. The varieties grown are Concord. Only the latter, occupying about two acres, is yet in bearing. These vines are out four by six feet, trained to etakes, and at the date of our visit they were loaded with luscious clusters. Estimating but five pounds to each vine, and 1.815 to the acre, we have a crop of nearly two tons, certainly a handsome yield, and evidence enough that the 'scouted section' will produce grapes. Mr. Spaulding gave us prima facio evidence, too, that it will produce corn at the rate of sixty-five bush els shelled to the acre-a result accomp plished by the aid of a moss-bunker in each hill at planting. This fish makes a valuable fertilizer, and is picatiful in Barnegat Bay and all along shore. Numerous fine pumpkins were interspersed among the rows of corn, and just a little one side, mel-ons—and such melons! There were experienced tasters in our party, and the ravages made were proof positive of excellence of quality. Fortunately the quantity was not deficient. Mr. Spaulding also had s good crop of sweet and common potatoes, and we left him and his extension table more than ever disposed to agree with those who think and speak kindly of the 'barrens.' Next morning we looked about among come of the cranberry meadows which abound in Ocean County. At Toms River Dr. J. R. Shrivo has over seven acres in full bearing. In 1865, he get a crop of 1,100 bushels; in 1866, 1,000 bushels; in 1867, 1,030 bushels. The average price was \$11:50 per barrel. Of course this result made the doctor feel pretty jully, but, like the good natured Oliver, he was not quite satisfied; so, during the past season; he put in eleven acres more. In the words of Virgil, 'Oh, fortunate medicine man, if

you did but know it!' Mr. A. II. Mylin has at this place a bog of five acros, eight years old. Last year it yielded 1,590 bushels, and he estimates this year's yield at 1,000, the falling off being accounted for by the ravages of the grasshopper-au enemy, by the way, from which cranberry growers have not previous to last summer. Mr. Mylin lives at Lancaster. Pennsylvania, and comes down occasionally 'to view the spot.' I saw him going away with a bright face, notwithstanding the deficiency in his crop.

Position In Sleeping.

If the meal has been recent and hearty, the arrest is more decided, and the precipice, or the pursuit of a wild beast, or other impending dangers, and the desperate effort to get rid of them, prouses us, and sends on the stagnating blood; and we wake in a fright or trembling, or in a perspiration, or feeling exhausted, according to the degree of singuition, and the length and strength of the efforts made to escape

But when we are unable to escape the danger—when we do fall over the precipice, when the trembling building crushes usthen? That is death! That is the death of those of whom it is said when found lifeless in the morning, ... That they were as well as ever they were the day before;" and often it is added, "and ate heartier than common!" This last, as a frequent cause of death to those who have gone to bed to wake no more, we give merely as a private opinion. The posibility of its truth is enough to deter any rational man from eating a late and hearty meal. This we do know with certainty, that waking up in the night with painful diarrhoa, or cholera, or bilious cholie, ending in death in a very short time, is probably transable to a late large meal. The truly wise will take the safe side. For persons who catthree times a day, it is amply sufficient to make the last meal of cold bread and butter, and a cup of some warm drink. 
