Town Council Meeting.

The first meeting of the new Council was held on last Monday evening, March 27th. Called to order by Town Clerk O'Donnell. All members were present.

Alex. H. Sutton was unanimously re-elected chairman for ensuing year.

Minutes of February meeting read and approved. Also such portion of town meeting records as contained instructions to Council.

Chairman appointed the following standing committees:

Highways, Messrs. Boyer, Liebfried, Watkis.

Property, DePuy, Watkis.

Law and Order, Watkis, Batchelor, DePuy.

Finance, and Printing, Liebfried, Boyer, Batchelor.

Fire, Water, and Light, Batchelor, DePuy, Boyer.

Licenses, all members of Council, Mr. Batchelor chairman.

Clerk directed to report at each regular meeting the amount remaining in each appropriation.

Rules governing last Council read, amended slightly, and adopted.

Voted, that committees shall make monthly reports in writing.

Fire, Water, and Light Committee reported electric lights not satisfactory.

Voted, that all bills approved by Council at February meeting, be now paid, as per vote of town meeting.

Bill for electric lights for March, \$97.25, read. Moved that bill be paid.

Mr. Batchelor moved that bill be returned to Mr. Ball, manager, and he be asked to deduct the contract amount for twenty lights, not burning. Amendment carried: but motion as amended lost.

Letter from Rocco Rupertone, asking pay for damage done by travel over his strawberry patch while roads were blocked by snow. Returned back for statement of amount claimed.

Mattio D'Agostino and Giuseppe Esposito presented applications for liquor licenses (each in his own hotel). Both referred to License committee.

Water proposition read from Emory P. Day, of Philadelphia.

Another from Am. Pipe Mfg. Co., Feul, Campbell & Co., Ocean City, withdrew their proposals for water

supply, and presented a substitute which seems to cover all phases, and in several respects is more favorable than any other received. Messrs. Jackson, French and Anderson are among the incorporators. Voted that all water propositions, and all matter on the subject received before April 10th, be given to Committee on Water, they to report at next meeting.

An ordinance was introduced and passed first reading, requiring the W. J. & S. S. B. B. to maintain safety gates at Vine Street, Fairview, and Sanitarium crossings; also, the P. & A. C. R. B. to erect gates at Orchard Street and Eleventh Street.

Voted, that our solicitor request the attorney of the F. G. U. receiver to secure an order to authorize the payment of the Society's past due taxes.

Solicitor Chandler gave written opinion that Hammonton has never had a legal Board of Health, as the council has never enacted an ordinance providing for the same, as required by state law.

Ordinance then introduced to establish a Board of Health, to be composed of seven members,—M. L. Jackson and J. T. French to serve four years; J. C. Anderson and Wm. Cunningham three years; George Bernshouse and J. H. Garton two years; Chas. Woodnutt one year. Passed first reading.

Moved by Mr. Batchelor, that the Clerk be instructed to notify the Electric Light Company that Council will hereafter require a strict fulfillment of contract. Carried.

Eli H. Chandler was re-appointed solicitor for one year, at same salary,—\$100.

Voted, that Council hold a special meeting on Thursday evening, March 30th, to transact any business that may be brought before it.

Adjourned at 11:30.

The Electric Light bill ordered paid. License Committee reported Esposito's application very defective. Referred to solicitor.

M. D'Agostino's application was granted.
