## BOSTON BERRY BUSINESS.

MR. EDITOR—A few words as to why  
Mr. Rider and the writer were sum-  
moned before the Inter-State Commerce  
Commission at Washington, as witness-  
es in the hearing of the case of N. J.  
Central R. R., vs. the New York, New  
Haven and Hartford R. R., on Friday,  
March 27, might be of interest to the  
fruit growers of Hammoncton if it were  
better understood.

As I understand the case, the N. Y.  
N. H. & H. R. R. refuse to receive,  
after April 30th, any more freight from  
the N. J. C. R. R. or the B. & O. R.  
R. on the plea that the ever increasing  
traffic on the East River makes it dan-  
gerous to operate the floats on which the  
freight cars are run at the Communi-  
paw, and carried to the Hartford termi-  
nal at Harlem. The Central offered to  
do all the transferring on their own  
floats, and deliver the same to Harlem;  
but the Hartford prefers to receive it  
from the Pennsylvania R. R. floats, or  
have it sent over the circuitous route  
of the Lehigh Valley to Poughkeepsie  
across the bridge, through Springfield  
to Boston, 181 miles farther, which, of  
course would be later in arriving, and  
for fruit very disastrous. In other  
words it seems to the writer to be a col-  
lusion of the N. Y. N. H. & H. and the  
Pennsy. The effect this will have on  
the Hammoncton and Elm fruit growers,  
will be to cut the Boston market; hence  
a large proportion of the speculative  
buyers, who ship large quantities of  
fruit for which they pay cash, will not  
come here, as they use the Boston mar-  
ket exclusively.

Growers all know what effect a con-  
gested market in New York and Phila-  
delphia has on their pocket. Boston  
business might be better appre-  
ciated if it was known that fifty refrig-  
erator cars were shipped from the Read-  
ing station last year—a season of short  
crops. Our experience with shipments  
via the Pennsy to Boston being very un-  
satisfactory, the effect of the foregoing  
threat will be more readily understood.

The hearing of the case was set for  
March 27 at the Inter-State Commerce  
Commissioners Rooms. The trial law-  
yer, a Mr. De Forest, was assisted by  
Mr. Bacon and Mr. Fithian, of Bridge-  
ton, very smart and capable men. The  
oppositions were represented by Mr.  
Robbins, and an assistant from New  
York City. His cross examination of  
some of the South Jersey witnesses was  
interesting, for he met his match more  
than once.

The case will be decided in the near  
future. In the mean time I personally  
think the Boston fruit business will be  
continued the same as in the past.

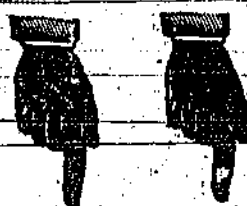
