"Respectable," or Riot?

The question of license or no-license has not yet been settled by a vote of the people, as it is believed that a count of the ballots may show that the vote was against it. In making this statement I do not attribute an unfair count, as no doubt the election officers discharged their duty; but a vote denied or thrown out for violation of law does not destroy the fact that such vote was also a record for or against license.

I do not believe that "tax payers" are the only ones to consider, as a man may be a tax-payer to-day and an unfortunate to-morrow. The ownership of property does not add intelligence. When tax-payers are willing to shoulder all the muskets in time of war, then I will be willing to concede that they have more rights than non-taxpayers, but not until then. Every man or woman who buys an article pays a tax thereon, hence, in considering license, every person in the community is interested.

It was a mistake to open the door to the consideration of license at the last meeting of Council. The vote on election day was too close and unsatisfactory, and that fact should have received consideration.

As the opponents of license will compel a struggle on this question every year, it is doubtful if any one with capital will risk the construction of an expensive building, with the liability of a refusal of license the succeeding year. Those who advocated license affirmed that a "respectable" hotel would be the result. From the applications received (which are but the beginning), it is evident that some regarded license as a wide opening of the doors. That is just what was predicted, by those who opposed it; and their predictions have been fulfilled very early.

The question now is whether license shall "run riot" in Hammonton. Did those who signed the Main Road application intend that point as the location of the only "respectable" hotel? Or did those who endorsed the Columbia House entertain the same view? Both parties claimed that the tavern was a "necessity," and so affirmed over their signatures.

The opening of the town to a bar-room at every corner would probably prove to be the best cure. If license must be tried, let the trial be complete. We will then have that many additions to the speak-easies, as every wine producer will sell his wine in some manner, and the "revenue" will about balance the court expenses. If one "respectable" place was the object, it can only hold for one year (provided no-license advocates will keep up their struggle), and at the proper time, when the new ordinance comes up for adoption, it will be seen how much sincerity existed in the claim for something that would "benefit the town," owing to improved roads.

A great many persons voted in favor of license who really believed that a respectable, well-managed hotel would lessen the number of speak-easies; but they did not dream of having the town made a collection of gin-mills. If those in power disregard public sentiment, they will find a harder road to travel than they encountered on last election day. The best thing to do is to refuse to adopt an ordinance, and refer the matter back to the people at the next town election.

Reduced Rates to New York via
Penna. R. R., account Dedication
of Grant Monument.

For the dedication of the Grant Monumental Tomb, April 27th, the Penna. Monday evening brought us a sudden and violent hail storm,—rather, a down-pour of "chunks" of ice, resembling very irregular and rough broken pieces of icicles. Such storms are very rare, and this one was unusually violent, breaking glass in hotbeds and green-houses all over town. Mr. Colwell reports that during the few minutes of its duration, the storm damaged his green-houses to the amount of twenty-five dollars. The skylights at Mr. Kiedler's photograph gallery was badly damaged; also the one in Bernshouse's bicycle repair shop, and on Black's store. Fortunately, there was no wind, so windows did not suffer. The average "stone" seemed to be about the size of a black walnut, and we saw one nearly three inches long. Buds and twigs were beaten from shade trees, but vegetation was not sufficiently developed to sustain serious damage.

The Proposed New Charter.

That our readers may know what it
is that the Town Council recommend to
replace our antiquated Town Charter,
we propose to give in our columns a
synopsis of its provisions, including the
latest amendments. It will probably
require several issues to present the
matter, as the law is very lengthy, cov-
ering fifty-four pages of the large
revision.

This law was approved April 24, '88,
is entitled "An act providing for the
formation and government of towns,"
and can be found in the new revised
general statutes of New Jersey issued in
1896, pages 3182 to 3545, inclusive.

Sec. 1. That the inhabitants of any
town or borough, or of any township
having a special charter, or of any town-
ship which has or hereafter may have a
population exceeding five thousand in-
habitants, may become a body politic
and corporate in fact and in law by the
name and title of "The Town of Ham-
moniton, in the County of Atlantic,"
wherever at any special election called
for that purpose, or at any town or
charter meeting, or election at which
the question of incorporating under this
act is submitted, as hereinafter provided,
it shall be so decided by a majority of
the voters thereof voting at any such
election.

2. Council may, on petition of fifty
resident freeholders, arrange by ordi-
nance for special election to vote on
reincorporation.

3. How such election shall be adver-
tised.

4. How said election shall be con-
ducted.

5. The new town shall be divided into
not less than three wards.

6. Officers under the old charter to
remain in office until certain date.

7. Council shall fill all new offices
created by the new charter.

8. New town shall inherit the prop-
erty, debts, and obligations of the old.

9. The new town officers shall be a
town council, consisting of two members
from each ward and one councilman at
large, town clerk, collector, treasurer,
attorney, assessor, recorder, one com-
missioner of appeal from each ward,
overseer of the poor, town surveyors,
pound keepers, board of education con-
sisting of three members from each
ward, three commissioners of assessment,
chief of police, chief engineer of fire
department, three constables in each
ward, justices of the peace as provided
by the Constitution, and one chosen
freeholder from each ward.

10. Terms how officers shall be elected.

11. Annual town election shall be
held on the second Tuesday in April.

12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17. Regulates the
annual town election, and says who can
hold office.

18, 19. Council can fill any vacancy
until next election, except on board of
education, whose members fill vacancies.

20, 21. All officers to be sworn in; the
clerk, treasurer, collector, to give bonds.

22, 23. Names time when terms of
office expire.

24. No officer of the town, elected or
appointed under this act, shall hold any
other office of profit or trust under this
act.

25. The clerk, collector, attorney,
recorder, assessor, police, overseer of
poor, surveyors, poundkeepers, com-
missioners of assessment and appeal,
and councilman, shall be paid salary or
fee fixed by council; no other town
officer to be paid.

26. All officers to be governed by
town ordinances; any except board of
education may be removed by a two-
thirds vote of council, after a fair
hearing.

27. Town clerk shall hold office for
two years, his duties being very much
the same as now. His office shall be at
the town hall, and he shall keep the
same open at such hours as council
prescribe.

28. Town collector's term shall be two
years, his office at the town hall; he
shall make each year to council a state-
ment of all moneys received; shall make
a full report annually on the first day of
April.

29. Town treasurer to serve two
years, his duties being the same as
now, but with closer requirements as to
keeping of accounts and making reports.

30. Treasurer shall also handle all
school moneys, as at present.

31. Treasurer shall report to council,

once a month, all moneys received and
disbursed, and shall whenever required
submit books and papers for audit by
council; make a full report on the first
of April.

32. Recorder to hold office two years.
His duties and powers, in case of vi-
olation of any town ordinance, or any
other law, shall be the same as those of
the Peace. But where the case makes
it advisable, he can issue a warrant
returnable forthwith, and hear the case
at once; where the offense calls for a
fine exceeding ten dollars, or imprison-
ment, there may be a trial by jury.

33. Any member of council, and any
policeman of said town, shall have the
power, on witnessing any breach of
the peace or any violation of town ordi-
nance, to forthwith arrest and take into
custody, without warrant, the offender
and take him before the recorder for a
hearing.

The Mississippi River, from the mouth
of the Ohio southward, has been so
swollen by extensive storms in the
territory drained by its tributaries, that
it is higher than at any time since 1840.
At many points the levees have been
overflowed; at others they yielded to a
terrible pressure of water, and untold
suffering has resulted. It is known
that at least two hundred human lives
have been lost, thousands of families
rendered homeless, cattle and horses
drowned, the money damage estimated
at one hundred million dollars. And
the flood is not abating. More than
one hundred towns and villages, in five
states, are covered with water, and the
inhabitants driven out. At one point
the Mississippi is said to be twenty-five
miles wide. Everything possible is
being done to relieve the sufferers, by
individuals, societies, and the national
government.

We call attention to our summary
of the proposed new government for
Hammoniton. Those who have exam-
ined the law pronounce it a desirable
improvement upon our antiquated
Charter. Further, it places us in reach
of legislative amendments when found
desirable. Our present Charter, being
a special compact, cannot be amended;
and therein is found the greatest
objection. Sections 32 and 33, published
to day, are especially desirable.
