

One of the leading editors of this country, J. M. Buckley, D.D., has said : 'So long as war was not declared, any citizen, without exposing himself to just imputation upon his patriotism, could oppose it, and argue strenuously in favor of using the peaceful arts of diplomacy. But war having been resolved upon by both branches of Congress, and the resolutions signed by the President, loyalty to the country now requires every citizen to support 'the powers that be,' which are ordained of God. Public attempts to show that the war was ill-advised, and unnecessary, are now out of place."

"That it shall not be lawful for the board of chosen fracholders, or township committee, or common council, or commissioners, of any county, city, township, town, or becough, in this state, to pay or disburse out of any moneys of said county, city, township, town, or borough, to any person, unloss the person claiming or receiving said moneys shall first present to the party or parties paying any such moneys a detailed bill of home or demand, specifying particularly how such bill or deban estab off ban que obace and the annea of the persons to whom the amounts composing such bill or domand were severally paid, with the ailidavit of the party chaining payment of said bill or demand that the same is cor-

Notice the words Italicized a bove,-"first," "detailed," "specifying partieularly," as well as "dates" and "names of partion."







THE AMERICAN HORSE.

He Finds Favor in Several Foreign

There has been a remarkable increase in the export of horses from the Buited States during the last few years, writes in W. E. Curtis to the Chicago Record. In 1893 the total number shipped to foreign countries was only 2,907. In 13,948, in 1896 to 25,126, and during the first six mouths of the present dscal year, ending Doc. 31, the total was 14. 232; so that if the same proportion is continued during the remaining six months the total for the year will be 28,464. Nearly half the entire exports in 1896 went to Great Britain, the exact number being 12,022; but it is believed that 1,000 or more additional were sent through Canada, the exports to the dominion being 5,305 horses. The trade with Great Britain in horses has shown in remarkable increase, for in 1893 the total exports were only 564 head. The Increase in exports to Germany was even greater, notwithstending the laws of that country, which are very annoying to Importers of five stock and quite

expensive. In 1893 we ahipped only thirty-three horses to the German enntre. In 1896 we shipped 3.686. 
