## County Board of Freeholders.

The old Board met on Tuesday last, French's Hotel, Hammonton,—nearly a full board being present. It was reported that nearly a mile of the new road from Egg Harbor City to May's Landing has been completed; but bad weather makes work slow. The County buys gravel for five cents per load, and for repairs on the main road has bought gravel lots in Egg Harbor City. The usual annual reports were read,—Insane Asylum, Almshouse, Finance, County Collector, etc. The Board, evidently realizing that the county has been robbed by the newspaper publishers who accepted \$25 per year for publishing the reports (it ought to have been \$50 at least), voted to patronize only a job printer this year. That is, decided to publish the report in pamphlet form. They tried that some years ago, and we remember seeing a pile of the books in our Freeholder's office for months, and finally, fly-specked and dusty, they were used for another purpose. We doubt whether a half-dozen reached tax-payers' hands. And similar disposition was made of them in other localities. It is a waste of public money for one man's benefit. Few publishers can afford to give the report without compensation, and the small amount paid covered the expense of composition, thus enabling them to give thousands of tax-payers information that they have a right to demand.

The Board and visitors dined at the hotel, as guests of Clerk Anderson, and had a right jolly good time.

The new Board met on Wednesday, at May's Landing, and elected officers as follows:

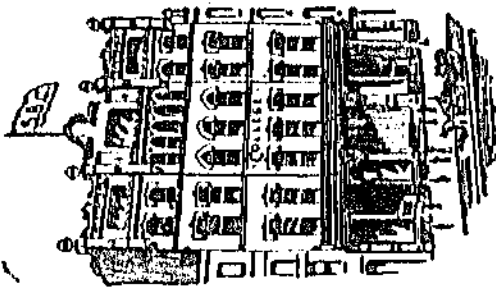
