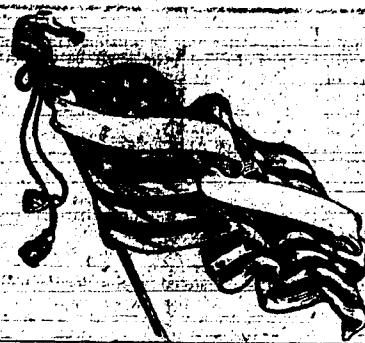

Our Washington Letter.

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 13, 1878.

Not a few here are disposed to look upon the

reported demands of Sir Edward Thornton on

our Government as to the last degree "cheeky."

Why we should establish a system of espionage

upon the Cimbria or any other vessel ar-

riving in American waters under similar cir-

cumstances, or why we should ignore the cour-

tesy, even friendship, which Russia observed

towards us during our long struggle for exist-

ence, at best of a power which was as

uniformly hostile, in refusing the Cimbria's

passengers transportation over American terri-

tory are considerations which Sir Edward with

all his diplomatic resources will find difficult

to solve to the satisfaction of the average Amer-

ican citizen. Nor does his other intimation

that we should burden ourselves with the ex-

penditure of a large army so that our Canadian

cousins may at once dismiss all apprehensions

of the Fenians, appear any more reasonable.

John Bull may reasonably expect us to observe

every international obligation, though none

probably better appreciates than himself how

little he deserves the slightest consideration

from us. While our Government will have the

countenance of every good citizen in complying

with the letter of the law, and in carrying out

in good faith, every obligation we voluntarily

assumed, any gratuitous service to a power that

did its level best to compass our destruction

would be approved by very few. Our merchants

have not forgotten how English subjects were

encouraged to build, arm and equip a fleet of

piratical cruisers that destroyed or drove, under

the protection of foreign flags, almost our en-

tire merchant marine out and that wrested from

them the large portion of the world's carrying

trade to build up and extend the commercial

supremacy of England and her dependencies.

We have not yet grown oblivious to the fact

that in Canadian cities, rebel emissaries plotting

the destruction of our lake commerce and

our border towns by fire after being exposed,

gagged and ravaged, were harbored and lion-

ized, and our wrath is still subject to occasional

that it is looked upon as detrimental if not

positively suicidal to the party, and is those who

may be forced by circumstances to become

prominent in the matter.




