The County Course at Central.

As there have been so many comments made on the use of the County course of study in our schools, I will endeavor to give some information to those who are not familiar with it.

There are three grades, with a post graduating course. The annual graduating class is composed of the graduates of the first grade.

The third grade is the lowest. The studies are arithmetic, grammar, geography, reading, spelling, writing, and history, the history reaching to the war of the Revolution. Arithmetic comprises fundamental operations, common and decimal fractions, bills and accounts, etc. Geography takes in all countries, climates, distribution of plants and animals, and manners, customs, etc., of all peoples.

The second grade comprises arithmetic (denominational numbers and practical measurements), advanced grammar, political geography, fifth reader, advanced spelling, writing, history to the war of 1812, and physiology.

The first grade comprises higher arithmetic, higher grammar, physical geography, reading from select literature, spelling, writing, history complete, physiology completed, book keeping (double entry with business forms), algebra (to quadratics), physics (general principles, mechanical powers, motions, hydrostatics, hydraulics, heat, light, sound, and pneumatics).

The post graduate, or advanced course, includes geometry, mensuration, algebra completed, general history, civil government, botany, rhetoric, etymology, and literature.

If the above is not "high" enough the Board can add other studies, such as Latin, German, French, etc.

The fact is that the recent course of study really differs but little from the County course, and the similarity may easily lead to a mistake in construing the instructions of the County Supt.

Graduates of our County course are admitted into Rutgers College, State Normal School, and other institutions. The certificate of our Central School has been recognized at Jefferson Medical College. I know these statements are true from my own experience.

Mr. Salisbury has aimed to advance our studies, and whether the Board agreed with him or not in some matters, his object was for the best, and to place our pupils on as high a plane as possible, yet I believe that the studies required in the County course are excellent, and certainly well advanced, as shown above. The Board expects to continue the higher studies which Mr. Salisbury introduced, whether he remains or not, and he has at least benefited our schools in that respect, establishing a precedent which will be adhered to.

I am prompted to publish this because it has been rumored that our schools will retrograde. Such is not the case, for though Mr. Salisbury will not be with us, he has sown good seed which will be permitted to bear its fruit, and studies in the future will be fully up to the past, no matter who may succeed him. His good work and example will be left behind him.
