CHAPTER OXXXII An act to provide for the drainage of lands. (Continued.)

4. And buit enected. That if the system of drainage which may be adopted in any case berein provided for shall require the obstruction bersin provided for shall require the obstruction or injury of any water course, or the alteration or lowering of any mill dam, or the permanent occupation of any island, whereby the owner or occupiar thereof shall be injured, or shall are alteration damage to his legal, rights, such damage shall be estimated and appraised by the said commissioners, and shall form part of the oxpenses of such drainings to be raised by assessment as herein directed; provided, that any person whose damage may be assessed shall and may appeal from the award of said commissioners, so far as settles to the amount of and may appeal from the award of said dom-missioners, so far as relates to the amount of said damage, to the then or next circuit court of the county in which such damage shall focus, which court shall cause a jury to be empanu-sled to try the said appeal without further pleadings and without other notice of trial than the service of a copy of said appeal upon the said commissioners, or one of them designating the time of trial at least ten days prior thereto, and the wedder of such a lury shall be conclus the time of trial at least ten days prior thereto, and the verdict of such a jury shall be conclusive as to the amount of said damage, unless set-aside for some illegality or misdirection of the court-but-such-appeal shall not have the effect of delaying or interrupting the proceedings of said commissioner, who shall be authorized to assume the money of the commissioner. ings of raid commissioners, who shall be au-thorised to assume the smount of said damage to be so assessed by them until the same shall be varied by such verdict of a jury, and en pay-ing or tendering the amount so assessed by them the said commissioners, to the party injured, or in case he is a non resident of this State, or remust be found, or is under any insapagity he receive the same, upon maying said amount, so assessed by them into the said supreme court the said commissioners may take possession of the property-in-question and proceed fe execute the work necessary to offect said drainage in accordance with toe plan adopted as afore, said; if the verdict of the jury be the same as, or shall be less than the award of the commissor shall be less than the award of the commissioners, the party appealing shall pay the costs of the appeal, or otherwise no costs shall be recovered on either side; if the verdict shall be greater than the award of the commissioners, the excess shall be added to the expense to be assessed for such drainage, at any time before the actual collection thereof, and shall be distributed to the parcels of land to be assessed therefor in the same proportion as the other expenses shall be assessed upon the same; if such excess be not ascertained, until

sessed therefor in the same proportion as the other expenses shall be assessed upon the same; if such excess be not accretained, until after the go eral assessment has been made, and the collection therefor commenced, a new 3 sessment of such excess shall be made in the same proportion as the general assessment and shall be relieved in the same manner.

5. And be it enacted, That to enable the said commissioners to raise the necessary moneys to carry on the work of draining said lands they are hereby authorised to borrow such sums from time to time, as may be necessary for that purpose at the legal rate of interest, and to give toeir bends as such commissioners therefor, and to pledge for the repayment thereof, the assessment to be made as aforesaid; provided, that the said commissioners shall not be personally bound to pay the said bonds or any interest thereoff and provided further, that if the said interest on said bonds (which interest shall not be made payable at shorter interval than once in every six months) shall not be paid, as the same may become due, it shall bear lawful interest until paid.

6. And be it enacted, That any vacancy happening among the commissioners so to be appointed by the supreme court shall be filled by the said court first stated term after such vanancy may occur, but until suil vacancy is alled, the other two nommissioners shall bear

hancy may occur, but ontil such vectory is alled, the other two nommissioners shall have full power to proceed with the duties of the commissioners, and in all cases the action or decision of any two of the commissioners shall be valid and sofficient; and the compensation commissioners also of the board of managers of the geological servey, when capaged on any ocompensation commissioners also of the board of managers of the geological survey, when cogaged on any tract, or in reference to the drainage thereof, shall be five dollars per day, and the expenses of said board of managers for their own time and services, and for compensation paid to any other persons in examining, surveying and reporting, in reference to any tract of land which they shall reporte a necessary or proper to be drained, shall be added by the commissioners to the expenses to be assessed for the drainage of said tract.

And be it enacted, That if at any time after any tract of land has been drained under this act, the ditches or other works of drainage shall require alterations or repairs, the supreme court on the application of any person interested in such drainage may appoint three commissioners to make said repairs, who shall qualify and proceed in the same manner as the original commissioners, and the expense when forced in whell he expense when

original commissioners, and the expense when footed up, shall be assessed upon the same lands which were assessed for the expense of the original drainage; and in precisely the same proportion, and the same remedy snall be had for the collection thereof.

## CHAPTER DXXVII.

An Act to make free the Public Schools of the State, and supplement to the act entitled "An.act to establish a system of public instruction," approved March twenty-first, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven,

1. Be it enacted by the Senate and Gen-oral Assembly of the State of New Jersey That for the purpose of maintaining free public schools there shall be assessed, levied and collected annually on the inhabi tants of this state, and upon the taxable, real and personal property therein, as ex-hibited by the last abstracts of ratables trom the several counties, made out by the several boards of assessors, and filed in the office of the comptroller of the treasury, a state school tax of two mids on each dollar of the valuation contained in said abstracts, which tax shall be as-ess-od, levied and collected at the same time, and in the same manner in which other state taxes are assessed, levied and col lected, and shall be in fou of a township school tax imposed by the act to which this is a supplement; but if the moneys this is a supplement; but if the moneys received by any township from the tax imposed by this set shall not be sufficient to maintain free schools for at least using months in each year, then the linhabitants thereof shall raise, by township tax, such additional amount as they may need for that purpose in the rame manner as such taxes have theretofore been raised; and if the inhabitance of any township, at for the support of pulsar sciools in this their annual cown are time, shall compare state, but that all such schools are better wide to the contract of the meetings

That it shall be the duty of the comptroller aforesaid to aportion the said tax, and at the rate aforesaid, among the several counties, in proportion to the amount of taxable, real and personal este of said counties respectively, as shown by the abstracts re-spectively, as aforesaid; and it shall be his further duty to transmit, on or before the first day of May of each year, to the county collector of each county, a state-ment of the amount of said tax apportioned to said county, and said county collector shall lay said statement before the board of assessors of the townships and wards, and said assessor shall there-upon proceed trapportion the taxes among said townships and wards, and said assessor shall thereupon proceed to apportion said school taxes, as other taxes are an-portioned, and to assess the same accord-

ing to law.
3. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the county collectors of the several counties of this state to pay to the treasurer of this stare the quotas due from their respective counties of the taxes imposed by this act, on or before the first day of January, annually, next ensuing

the assessment thereof.

4. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the state superintendent of public instruction, under the direction of the trustees of the school fund, on or be-fore the first day of January of each and every year, to apportion the moneys re-ceived from the tax imposed by this act, among the several counties of this state, in proportion to the number of children included in the last published school census of the said counties respectively; provid-ed, that all the children residing in frac-tional districts situated in two or more adjoining counties, shall be included in the census of that county in which the fraction containing the school-house is situ-ated; and it shall be his further duty, on or before the tenth of January in each and every year, to draw orders on the comptroller of the treasury, and in favor of the county collector, for the payment of the money thus apportioned, and the said county collectors shall apply for and he payment of the money thus apportioned. be entitled to receive the moneys thus ap-portioned as soon as the orders for the same are received; and provided further, that no portion of said moneys shall be apprecioned to or be used for the support

of sectarian schools.

5. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the county superintendent of each county to apportion to the several townships of his county, and to the towns and cities therein, not included in said township, and also to the several school districts, the state school money, togother with the interest of the surplus revenue belonging to said county, and such other moneys as may be raised for school pur-poses, upon the basis of the last published school census; provided, that all the children residing in the fractional districts ships, shall be theluded in the census of that cownship in which the fraction con-taining the school house is rituated; and provided also, that no districts, except those which have less than forty-five children, shall receive less than three hund-red and fitty dollars; and it shall be his further duty, on or before the tenth day of February of each and every year, to draw orders on the county collector, and in favor of the township collectors and city treasurers of his county, for the payment of said moneys so apportioned, and said collectors and treasurers shall apply to and be entitled to receive the same as

soon as such orders are received. 6. And be it enacted. That all school moneys belonging to fractional districts shall be held, subject to the order of the trustees, by the collector of that township in which the fraction containing the school house is situated.

7. And be it concited, That in addition to the tax imposed by this not, each city and school district may raise by tax such other sums of money as they may need for school purposes in accordance with the authority granted them by the act of which this is a supplement, or by any special act applicable to such city or school district; provided, that whonever any district school neuting shall be held, pursuant to the provisions of section eighty of the act to which this is a supplement, or at the call of the trustees, as provided in the eleventh division of the thirty ninth nection of said sot, and it shall not be lawful for such meeting to order a greater sum of money to be raised by district tax, than shall have been mentioned and dea in a shall have been month ned and designated in the notice of such meeting set up in the manner required by law; and provided further, that whenever in the judgment of the trustees of any district it shall not be necessary to levy a district tax for school purposes; the district clerk thursof shall not be trusteen to the district of the set of the s thereof shall not set up the notices directed to be given in said section sighty of the act to which this is a supplement.

8. And be it enacted. That no school district shall hereafter be formed which shall contain less than seventy-five children between five and eighteen years of age; and that after the passage of this not, each incorporated city or town shall constitute but one school district for all school purposes; and that such consoli-dated clarriet shall hold all the property, and be liable for all the lawful debts of the district so consolidated

9. And be it enacted. That after the expiration of the present school year it shall not be lawful to charge turtion feethe to all proof explored a proof 1000

eighteen years of age, residing within the district, so long as such schools can to maintained with the public school funds.

10. And be it enacted, That not more than twenty dollars annually of the school moneys received by any school district, except such as may be raised within a dirtict, shall be used for my other purposes than the payment of teachers' salaries, and for purposes of the payment of the p and for purchasing fuel.

11. 'And be it exacted, That in case

any school district or city shall use any of the school money apportioned to it, for any other it an public school purposee, such district or city shall forfeit out of the next annual apportionment a sum equal to twice the amount thus used; and shall be the duty of the county superintendent to re-apportion the money thus forfeited, among the other districts and cities in his county; provided the state superintendent may remit such penalty

12. And be it enacted, That in case of the failure of any district clerk or superintendent to send his annual report to the county superintendent of his county in the form prescribed, on or before the first of September, such county superintendent shall make up his report for such district or city, from the last published report of the state-suptrintendent; in making up such report, however, he shall deduct one-fifth from the school census; provided however, that all such cases of delay or negligence shall be reported to the state superintendent of public instruction whose duty it shall be to investigate the same and to restore the number deducted from the school census in all cases, when he receives satisfactory reasons for such delay

And be it enacted, That the county superintendent shall have power to administer all necessary oathsor affirmations to district clerks and other school officers, or which he shall receive no compensa-

14. And be it enacted, That section seventy-six, together with such other parts of the act to which this is a supplement, and all other acts or parts of acts as are in conflict with the provisions o this act, be and the same are hereby re-




