

by the keeper with a list of all the prisoners, and shall ascertain, by actual inspection, whether all prisoners named in the list are in the situation therein stated; and they shall make a report of the result of such visits and examinations, and of all such matters and things connected with said prison as they may deem necessary, to the meetings of the inspectors, and officer by them required, which reports shall be entered in the minutes of said inspectors, and a copy thereof transmitted to the board of supervisors; it shall appear in the report of the said inspectors to the board of supervisors, to the satisfaction of the board of inspectors, or the board of supervisors that the keeper or his assistant, or any of his deputies or assistants do not strictly perform their respective duties, or do in any way mismanage the affairs of the prison, then it shall be the duty of the board forthwith to remove said keeper and keeper thereof, and of any of his deputies or assistants, or neglect or failure, particularly specifying the nature of the failure complained of and disapproving said keeper shall continue, or suffer said deputies or assistants to continue, such neglect, neglect or failure, the board shall immediately remove said keeper, or one of the deputies of the keeper, or remove such persons, to remove said keeper or any of his deputies, and it shall be the duty of the board to remove or justify, upon such petition being presented to him, to institute in a summary way, such inquiry into the truth of the facts stated in the petition as he may think fit; and if, upon such inquiry, it shall appear to the board and the opinion of the keeper be such as to require that said keeper be wilfully continued, or suffered to be continued, such neglect, neglect or failure, he shall forthwith resign, and thereupon all his duties and responsibilities shall be immediately ceased, and a deputy keeper shall be appointed according to law.
