

#### Railroad Rates Considered.

It will be recalled that the State Civi reduration took early action in opposition to the announced imposition of added burdens on commuters traveling etween Philadelphia and Shore points The result of that action is the advice of Mesere, Colby and Whiting (the firm comprises State Senator Everett Colby of the Interstate Commerce Law, as amended by the Hepburn Act, the Interatate Commerce Commission has jursdiction to inquire into the justice, fairness and reasonableness of rates for such transportation (from Philadelphia by ferry and rail to seashore points in South Jersey), and upon a proper case made, to afford relief and prescribe the

maximum rates to be charged. It is further advised that such Association as the State Civic Federation "is empowered to complain" to the Commission; and also that "under authorative decisions" the facts involved in the transportation of passengers from Philadelphia to points in South Jersey "suffice to subject the carrier concerned to the jurisdiction of the Federal Com-

-It-being established that the Comand that the State Civic Federation is empowered to complain, all that is necessary to carry the case to its hearing is the co-operation of commuters and all other interested persons, such as real estate agents and property owners, in every community affected by the heavy burden arbitrarily imposed on hem. Such persons are urged to send beir pames at ours to John A. Burgan, South Jersey member of the Executive Board of the State Civic Federation. who has accepted the duty of organizing the interested persons, and will give all information as to the plan contemplated to rectily the injustice done at the instance of corporate greed and in utter disregard-of the interests of commuters and the growing towns in which they live. No time should be est to getting organized, so that action may be taken at the earliest moment.

#### Burning Brush.

The State Forest Commission call attention to the fact that permits ( burn brush, waste, etc., are required only in townships or other municipalities in which fire wardens have been apnointed. Further, that even in such townships permits are not now neces sary when the fire is in a public road. a garden, or a plowed field, and is mor than 200 feet from any woodland, brush laud, or field containing dry grass or other\_inflammable\_material. In all other cases permits must be obtained from the fire warden at all times of the year (not only from March 10 to May 31, as formerly).

The winimum penalty for burning brush without a permit has been reduced from \$50 to \$20, -- For all other violators of the Fire Law the penalty is still not less than \$50. In all munici palities without drowardens no permits are required under any circumstances.


